Displeasing hairstyle leads to \$10,000 damages lawsuit

A woman filed suit in Oakland Coun ty Circuit Court last week asking for more than \$10,000 in damages from a Farmington beauty salon.

Jean Clemente of Livonia filed the complaint Nov. 6 against Hair It Is, 21017 Farmington Road.

In part, the complaint states: "Plain-tiff suffered injuries to her neck as well as injuries and damages in that her hall closed like a broom after the per-manent, and came out of her head in handfuls."

According to the complaint, Ms Clemente went to Hair It Is for a per-manent wave on or about Jan. 16, 1978.

Ms. Clemente states in the complaint that Hair It Is should have known that her hair should not be cut short because of its fine texture and because her hair was listed.

The complaint states "that on said date and at said location, defendant's employee did cut plaintiffs hair too short before giving the permanent wave and left the permanent wave on for too long a period." Robert Thompson, attorney for Hair It Is, said Thursday he would not comment on the Jussey he

"We have no knowledge of suit being filed. We don't know what we're served with," Thompson said. "We can't com-

ment on something that's not in our hands."

James D. Murphy Jr., representing Ms. Clemente, said it took 22 months to file the lawsuit because of negotiations with the beauty salor's insurance company and a delay in medical reports.


