Signed jeans offer more than a name

A jean used to be a jean. That was until designers started branding the pockets with their names.

Now traditional American blue jeans rarely look scruffy. They come signed, with special stitching, shaped pockets and even initialed belts.

At a recent trunk showing of Bill Blass creations, customers at The Phoenix in Romeo got a look at how far the art of jean designing has come.

There are three basic fabrics — denim, the stretch fabric lustre group which includes velvet for the holidays and faille cloth. Colors range from bleached denim and bright tropical colors for spring to black velvet.

"Naturally, denim is the number one seller across the nation." said Loew, who is based in Filmt.

Blass, who designs for both women and men, is known for putting gray stitching on blue denim.

Featured on some of the jeans this year are scalloped pockets.
Loew feels the best feature of the pants is the fit. They have a contour waistband, with two inches less width at the top than the bottom of the waistband.

"This eliminates the gap in the small of the back," he said of the jeans, which

come in sizes four through 16.


