## Education benefits available

Half of the veterans of the Vietnam war - about five million people - are still eligible for educational benefits under the GI Bill, according to the Veterans Administration.

It is estimated that the eligibility will expire for more than 880,000 of those veterans within the next 12 months.

"Veterans are eligible for educational benefits up to the 10th anniversary of their separation from military service," said Louis Brohl III, an admissions director at Madonna College.

Madonna College offers special veteran's counseling by appointment. In addition, a computer terminal with access to an information center in Lans-

ing offers updates on career opportunities.

"Veterans may find they are closer to a degree than they thought," Brohl said. "Madonna offers credit for experimental learning as demonstrated in successful testing."

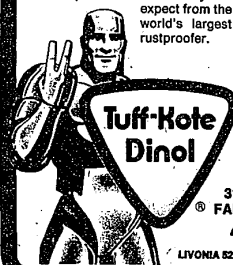
