To Whom It May Concern:

Notice is Hereby Given that pursuant to Act 43 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan for the year 1963, Second Extra Session, and Article VII, Section 32 of the 1963 Michigan Constitution, and the Code of Federal Regulations 52 C.F.R. 31, the Oakland County Board of Commissioners will hold a public hearing on the Proposed Budget for the year 1980. The hearing will be held in the Court House Auditorium in the Oakland County Service Center, 1200 North Telegraph Road, Pontiac, Michigan at 10:00 o'clock A.M. Eastern Standard Time, December 6, 1979.

Interested citizens may appear and present written and/or verbal comments on the proposed Budget and particularly the manner they think the County's allocation of Federal Revenue Sharing Funds should be spent. The recommendation in the proposed 1980 Budget states:

"That the \$3.6 million 1980 Revenue Sharing Funds be equally divided between the Sheriff's Department and the Prosecutor's Office," as included in the following budget summary:
