Both Lucia, whose design is called "Mother and Child," and Teresa, who designed "The Holy Family," are award-winning art students.

Lucia, the 15-year-old daughter of Mrs. Nellie Kemmenu, of 35970 Johnstown, has won first place in the school's safety poster contest, and honorable mention in the national safety poster contest, and saving bonds from the Society of Auto-

motive Engineers and the Farmington Commission on Aging for her work.

Teresa, the 17-year-old daughter of Mrs. Gerladine Powell, of 17249 Sumner, in Redford, has won a Gold Key in the 1979 Scholastic Art Awards, an honorable mention and a second place in the national safety poster contest.

New designs are offered each year.



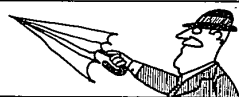

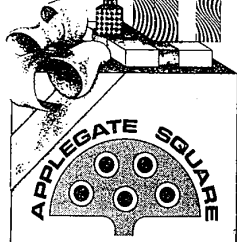

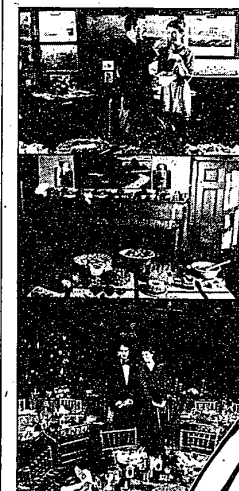
