'Black Journal' returns

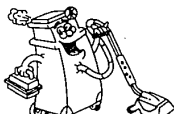

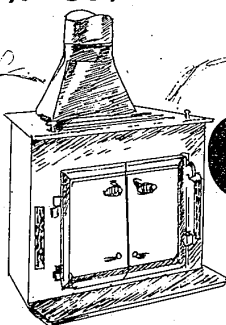
