

# in the pocket/W.W. Edgar

One of the most outstanding developments in bowling in the western suburbs the past decade is the growth in the number of classics.

There was a time when the old Detroit Times Classic (now the Bonanza Classic) was the lone all-star circuit in the metropolitan area. Even then there was trouble filling the lineups of all the teams to meet the average requirements.

Now, with the abundance of bowlers who meet the standards of all-star, there is a classic in most every major

house. These classics are producing some of the best competition in the area along with writing new chapters in the record books.

For instance, the classics at Wonderland, Bel-Aire, Westland and Super Bowl in Canton, are on a par with the better leagues in the entire state.

A fine example was set during the past week when seven 700 series were registered and one of the teams in the Wonderland Classic — Mike Foley's squad — registered a 346 series to make a bid for a place on the national

honor roll.

**THE HIGH SCORING** reached a peak at Westland when four sharpshooters in the Little Caesar loop broke the 700 barrier.

Showing the way on this heavy firing was Bob Golke with games of 298, 224 and 248 for a 766. Right behind him came Pat Cossett with counts of 235, 269 and 232 for 735.

Dick Beattie was next in line with fancy counts of 237, 266 and 200 for 702.

Steve Hubble joined in the fun, but had to be content with fourth place even though he had games of 246 and 267 for a 700.

In the women's section Nicci Cuzzart was tops with 211 in 592 and Julie Zimmermann had a 204 in 550.

**REL-AIRE LANES**, now making a bid to become one of the high scoring houses in the area, produced two 700 barrier breakers and they came in different leagues.

Randy Ostwine came through in the senior house league with a 266 opener in 706 and Jerry Smiddy used a 266 opener for a 704 in the Classic.

One of the features in the senior house loop was the fact that Bob Mertz, who had open heart surgery only last year, came back to roll a 689 series for

second place in the night's play.

Trailing Smiddy in the classic, Chuck Roama had a 264 in 695 and Jim Sheip had a 267 for high game.

**FAR REMOVED** from the Classics, Ken Eleniche turned in a surprising 731 in the Bator league at Woodland Lanes. He opened with a 247, followed with 246 and closed with 231 for 731. While he was doing that, Randy Smith fired a 279 for high game in the league and finished with a 671.

In the Morning Glories league Karen Barscy, a 152 bowler, turned in a 558. Another star of the week was Steve Belletari. Bowling in the Saturday Kids league, he rolled games of 222, 203 and 223 for a 649.

**DAVE HAMILTON**, the youthful star who has been on a scoring spree at Farmington Lanes, added another 600 series to his credit. This time he posted a 212 in 605 in the high school league but had to yield top honors to Mike Thurman who rolled a 558. In the ladies classic Barbara Hausch showed the way with a 214 in 602.

**DORIS MACORKINDALE** took the major share of honors in the Livonia Ladies classic. She tied Joan Lewis at 227 in the first game, won the second with 188-35 — 223 and then took the series with 547-1-5 — 605.

After tying in the first game, Lewis won the third with 213-29 — 242.

## County parks offer trails for snowmobiles

While snowmobilers in southeast Michigan are tuning up their machines, the staff at Addison Oaks County Park is preparing for what could be a peak snowmobile season.

The 700-acre wooded park, with 13 miles of winding snowmobile trails, requires a lot of preparation before the snow flies.

Once there is a sufficient snow base, Addison Oaks, located on West Romeo Road, 12 miles north of Rochester, will be open for snowmobiling every Saturday and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

Park supervisor Frank Ostrowski said the park crew has been working since Labor Day making the transition from summer to winter activities.

"We've put up snow fences on hills around the lake and along the quarter mile dragstrip. We've mowed the trails, brush cut the sides, filed holes, picked rocks out of the area and put up barricades, signs and markers," Ostrowski said.

**ONCE THE SNOW** hits, trail preparations become a daily ritual for the crew. "We use a bulldozer and a professional trail groomer," said Ostrowski. "When we get five-foot drifts, the bulldozer removes the snow from the trails or puts it back when there's not

enough snow. It's a dual purpose machine."

Besides preparing the snow paths, park workers expand the main parking lot to accommodate more cars and trailers. They also winterize the concession building and tune up their safety patrol machines.

The park's patrolmobiles are equipped with flashing lights and identification logos. "We supervise the trails at all times," said Ostrowski. "People aren't left on their own. If they break down, we bring them back in."

"We also have first aid kits, an ambulance and two people who are well trained in first aid. We're well equipped to get injured people out of the woods," Ostrowski added.

"Snowmobilers should prepare their machines in the fall," the park supervisor advised. "The average owner should be able to change the spark plugs, put in fresh gasoline and oil, grease the machine and visually check it."

"Novices should learn the characteristics of their machines and learn to ride the machine correctly before taking the trails. They should also dress warm so they can really enjoy the sport," Ostrowski added.
