**Inglanitsky Ltd. Antiques**—A collection of netukes is on display in the offices of the firm, second floor of Merrill Wood Mall. Many of the 300 are signed and dated to the 18th century. Netukes are beautifully carved or decorated examples of Japanese art, worn on the sash of the man as a counter weight to hold a purse or case. Exhibit is open 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. through December.

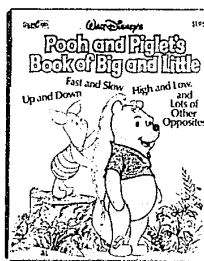

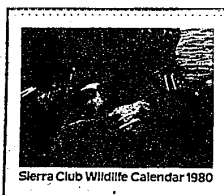

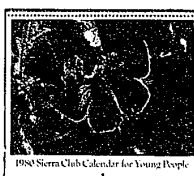
