Social engineers needed for reform

Research and development — the process that put microwave ovens into titchens and man the space — bolds equal promise for improving the welfare system and other human services. According to Jack Rothman, University of Michigan professor of social work, the same techniques used for decades by science and industry can be successfully applied to problems: in public assistance, child care, preventive health care and other social services.

He explains how in "Social R&D; Research and Development in the Human Services," just published by Prentice-Hall. The book, aimed both at researchers and educators on campus and professionals in the social service, fields, ents systematic and encompa guidelines for converting innovative ideas into effective programs.

"RESEARCH and development is the link between the knowledge producers and the ultimate consumers," Rothman

explains.

"Hundreds of articles are published on group behavior and social services delivery"— only to be read by other scholars. The scholars argue that practitioners should be more sophisticated in applying the results of current research.

"The practitioners complain that the research is garbled by technical jargon and is often irrelevant to the 'real world."

"The result has been a giant commu-rications gap between researchers, practitioners and policy makers," Rothman says. "What is needed is a kind of 'social engineer' who could con-vert scientific data into workable pro-grams, analogous to the traditional en-gineer in science and industry."

ROTHMAN and his assoicates assumed that role themselves as they conducted the U-M'S Community Inter-vention Project (CIP) under a grant from the National Institute of Mental Health.

For 10 years CIP collected research data, converted them to "action guidelines," made them operational in 22 lo-

"The methodology works. In Just nine months we recorded dozens of examples of successful interventions: task forces began working on problems relatef to education and unemployment; outreach services were provided to clients of neighborhood health clinic; a rotating library of toys, books and other equipment was established for 10 day care centers.

"Though we were not able to bring about the ellimination of mental illness or poverty or the bursting forth of racial harmony, the number of tangible, goal-specific accomplishments was inpressive." Rothman says. "R and D methods can aid the design of both large scale programs for a large client population and clinical techniques for the treatment of individuals."

Rothman's book is especially timely, notes Columbia University Professor Amital Exioni in his foreword, "as the country enters the third leg of the movement from Big Government to Anti-Government, to Effective and Responsive Government.

"THE LATE '50s and '70s have seemed characterized by a reaction against the excessive oplimism investigation to the rest society programs. But while most of the public were down on the government as it ws, tivey had a long and impressive list of matters they wished the government or provide for, such as support for college students and National Health Insurance."

The next step, Etzioni says, is for less but more government, a smaller budget, fewer regulations, less paperwork— but more service delivery and more responsiveness to the people.

"Social R and D is the only way to find out — without massive washes coersion and alleration — which programs work and work well," Etzioni cucludes.

Rothman's comprehensive volume explains how to go about it, covering a basic introduction to research and development, steps in the R and D process, conclusions and case studies. This not the last word on the subject of so-cial R and D," the U-M author notes. "It is among the first. Yet we believe it is a significant enceptual breakthrough for the application of social science knowledge in confronting the serious social and human problems that plague contemporary society."
