Gunman strikes Hills business

Two men walked out of Merchandise Mart, 27600 Eight Mile, Farmington Hills, Sunday evening with \$500 in bills and change after one of them pointed a silver handgun at the store's manager.

Store manager Melvin Stimmel was walking down an aisle when he met a man who has asked to see him.

"I want to see you. I want your money," said the man whom Stimmel described as six feet tall, 18-24 years old with straight, light brown hair and a light mustache. The man wore blue po-

lyester knit pants, a brown hip-length jacket and black shoes with three inch heels.

Stimmel told the man, "You're kidding." The man then pointed a gun at him and took the small brown cloth money bag he has in his hands.

Waiting in the store's entrance was another man described as about 5 feet six inches tall, 18 years old with straight, light brown shoulder-length hair. The second man wore a dark blue nylon ski jacket and blue jeans.

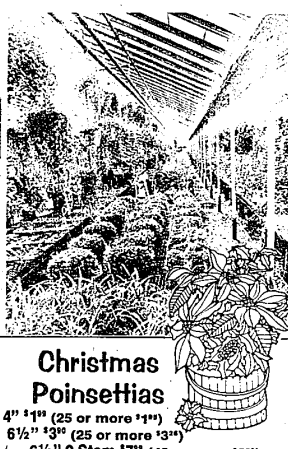
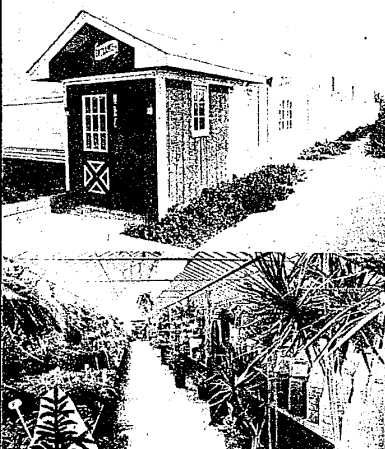
One unusual item will be an electron-

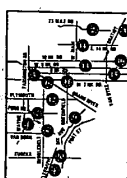
