rier if it can be celebrated without having to worry about how to pay for it. There's still time to apply to the holiday season the same budgeting and stopping principles that make sense throughout the year. The first step in budgeting is to figure out how much money from the normal, day-to-day operations can be made available for holiday expenses. Add any amounts set aside for the holidays, such as Christmas Club proceeds, to this figure along with any unusual income, such as end-of-year bonuses or tips.

Against this total, expenses must be balanced. Presents for others probably account for the lion's share of holiday costs. A list of recipients, with gift ideas and a price range for each, will provide an estimate of how much gifts will cost. Also consider other expenses, such as food, entertaining, travel, decorations, Christmas cards and postage.

With these calculations done, the

budgeter can tell at a glance whether available funds equal or exceed estimated expenses. If they do, it's time to start carrying out the plan. If they don't it's back to the drawing board temporarily to shift the budget into balance.

temporarily to saint the bunget into balance. If additional money can't be found, the best way is to re-examine expenses and shave most or all of them to the extent that's needed. An alternative for some families — but definitely not rail — is short-term use of credit. For peace of mind, borrowings should be kept low enough so that they can be paid back over a short period without taxing the household's regular budget. Overuse of existing credit, such as charge accounts; as common cause of the post-holiday blues.

HOLIDAY SHOPPING requires the same patient attention to price and quality that intelligent consumers use all the time. It can offer good buying opportunities because businesses com-

pete during what is for them, a very important time of year. However, the facts that business is so brisk and that so many purchases are for other per-sons add importance to the following

so many purchases are for other persons add importance to the following buying rules:

Deal with reputable merchants, evaluating them according to past experience or advice from friends. Street vendors and stores that operate only during the holiday session won't be around later to satisty complaints or make exchanges which most established businesses handle in stride.

Check refund and exchange policies carefully before buying a gift. Will he store make refunds or exchanges? Must the item be returned to the point the properties of purchase? Is a tocation available that is convenient to the recipient? Many items on sale before the holidays can't be returned afterwards, and many items that go on sale after the holidays are eligible for refunds or exchanges only at the sale price.

Read warranties. They should be in-writing, and a copy should be supplied with the gift so the recipient will know what to do if anything is unsatisfactory. Assume that nothing will be re funded unless a written agreemen says otherwise. Warranties and refund exchange policies are as important fo a layaway Item as they are for a con a layaway item as they are for a con ventional purchase.
