'Bach for a Buck' is back

After a two-year hiatus, "Bach for a Buck" is back to the original buck. "For the purposes of moving to a new location, we decided to resume the name and price that resulted in its instant popularity," said Raymond Benner, founder and artistic director. The new location is North Congregational Church at Lahser and Northwestern. It is on the southbound service drive just south of the Marathon gas station. The repeat concerts are scheduled for Dec. 26 and 27 at 8 p.m. Admission is \$1. Participating in the concerts will be young artists home for the holidays from the leading colleges and conservatories throughout the country. The concerts will be the culminating event following a week of Bach workshop sessions. "Bach for a Buck" is the winter affiliate for the yearly summer school, Workshop in the Woods. Southfield soprano Leslye Sklar will be the soloist in Bach's Cantata No. 51 with Doug Morton playing the trumpet obligato. Sixteen-year-old Susan Synnvedt of Royal Oak will be the violin soloist in the Concerto in D minor for Violin and Orchestra.

Examining life in outer space

Life on other planets and scientific art dating from 15th century exploration will be topics of new classes for adults this winter at Cranbrook Institute of Science. "Exobiology," a five-week course that examines extraterrestrial life from an astronomical perspective, will begin Jan. 10. Other adult classes to be held in January, February and March include "Seasonal Skies," "Terrariums and Indoor Light Gardens," "Nature Photography: Advanced Still-life Techniques," "Introduction to Anthropology," "Indian Cultures of the Great Lakes" and "Identification of Minerals." Also scheduled are "Introduction to Beekeeping," "Basic Astronomy," "Introductory Lapidary" and "Faceting and Advanced Lapidary."
