## Kids challenge computer in U. of D. math contest

More than 200 high school math students will match wits with a computer and each other in the University of Detroit Computer Contest beginning Jan. 12 at the U. of D. main campus, McNichols and Livernois. Our Lady of Mercy High School of Farmington Hills will be one of the 44 metro area schools participating in the math competition. Using the BASIC (Beginner's All-purpose Symbolic Instruction Code) computer language, four-member teams will solve business and math problems by programming computer terminals. The teams will undergo three hours of computer testing on Jan. 12-13 or 19-20 before reaching the Feb. 9 final round. U of D will award a \$500 scholarship to the winning team and trophies to the runners-up. "To our knowledge, this is the only computer competition of its kind in the state," said Robert Kane, a U. of D. math professor and coordinator of the contest. "We have patterned our contest after the American Computing Machinery 'Collegiate Programming Contest'." Schools from the tri-county Detroit area, Windsor and Ann Arbor will compete in the contest.
