

# Falcons 4th in mat tourney

Plymouth Salem captured its own wrestling tourney for the first time Saturday.

The Rocks dominated the 16-team field with 205 points. Westland John Glenn was second with 154½ followed by Trenton (146) and Farmington (6). Salem coach Ron Krueger was all smiles as a result of his team's fourth straight invitational title this season.

"Our kids rose to the occasion," said Krueger. "We wanted to win our own tourney. I'm surprised and pleased. This is the best we've done this year." Salem had the tournament wrapped up even before the finals, which drew a large crowd.

Jim Schultz (21-2 record) of Salem won the 107-pound weight class with an

11-6 decision over Farmington's David Denny. Schultz had pinned three of his previous opponents enroute to the title. Salem had two other individual winners — Jerry Valchine (140) and Steve Szilagyi (169).

Valchine dominated Keith Briggs of Bay City Western in the finals while Szilagyi gained revenge by beating Plymouth Canton's Dave Vaughan, 3-1, in overtime.

In the Canton Invitational two weeks ago Vaughan dethroned Szilagyi in the finals, also in overtime.

"SZILAGYI beat three real good kids," Krueger said. "He did a super job in this tournament."

Canton coach Dan Chrenko was not happy with the officiating in the Szila-

gy-Vaughan match which ended in a 7-7 tie during regulation time.

Chrenko said Szilagyi gained a take-down point while Vaughan was adjusting his mask.

"I don't want to take anything away from the Salem wrestler," said Chrenko. "But I thought the officiating was poor in that match. Dave's mask popped off and he went to adjust it. He then was taken down."

The loss snapped an 11-match victory string for Vaughan.

Salem had three other wrestlers in the finals. Farmington's John Murphy raised his record to 15-3 by dethroning Salem's Jeff Brown in the finals, 5-3, at 121 pounds.

Dave Drouillard of Dearborn Heights Annapolis won an 8-3 decision over Salem's Mark Ross at 128 pounds. Ross' record dropped to 22-2.

Farmington's Greg Lemanski took the 187-pound division with a cradle pin against Salem's Jeff Powers at 4:29. Both wrestlers have only two losses between them this year.

Bloomfield Hills Lahser, which finished ninth overall, got good performances from John Segula (114) and Joey Levier (134). Both won titles.

Segula beat North Farmington's John Donowen with a 10-6 decision in the finals while Levier edged Glenn's Greg O'Neill, 1-0. Levier also got by Southfield-Lathrup's Allan Oppenheim in the semifinals, 1-0.

Segula, who placed sixth in Class A last year, now sports a record of 13-2. The tournament's most valuable wrestler, Scott Rechsteiner (147) of Bay City was impressive in the finals as he pinned Ypsilanti's Mike Marsh in 5:33.

THE HEAVYWEIGHT final went to Ypsilanti's Scott Slusser who kept his unbeaten streak at 16 in with a 5-2 decision over Mt. Clemens' Shawn Thacker.

## Mott topples OCC '5'

Oakland Community College's basketball team can no longer claim unbeaten status in the Eastern Conference of the Michigan Community College Athletic Association.

Litas Ferguson, a 6-foot-8 center for Flint Mott Community College, scored 23 points, including six in overtime, to pace his team's 88-82 win over OCC in an Eastern Conference contest last Saturday.

Catch Tom McPhillips' OCC squad, now 6-1 in conference play and 9-5 overall, has a crucial game with Saginaw Delta Community College next Saturday. The two teams are tied for the conference lead.

Against Mott, OCC led by one point (34-33) at halftime and then went up by as many as five points (76-71) during the second half. But Mott came back to tie it at 78-all after regulation play and

outscored OCC, 10-4, in the overtime period.

Anthony Bernard, a 6-1 guard who prepped at Pontiac Catholic, led the team with 24 points, including all four of OCC's overtime markers. Darryl Clausell, a prep standout at Southfield High, followed with 20 points, and Phil Bouknight had 15.

OCC's John James contributed eight points, dished out 12 assists and pulled down 10 rebounds.

Mott had good scoring balance with three players in double figures behind Ferguson. Both teams made 36 field goals. OCC went 10 for 10 from the free throw line, while Mott hit 16 of 21.

The Delta-OCC game begins at 8 p.m. Saturday at OCC's new fieldhouse on the Orchard Ridge campus in Farmington Hills.

JOHN GLENN had two individual champs — Gary Balack (200) and Ken Hodges (157).

In the final match of the night, Black defeated Bay City's Bob Rugsstein, 5-3, while Hodges lifted his record to 12-3 with an 11-2 decision over Trenton's Steve Pierce.

"We felt we did a pretty good job," said Glenn coach Bob Lusk. "This was a well-run tourney with a lot of good individuals. Gary (Black) did a good job. This is only his first year on the varsity."

Another Glenn finalist was Pete Bologna (100) who lost to Al Prussac of Annapolis, 7-0. Prussac showed some quick moves in winning the championship.
