

Symphony programs musical fireworks

A symphonic fireworks of sorts is planned for the West Bloomfield Symphony Orchestra's first concert of the '80s.

On Jan. 27, the music of Verdi, Beethoven, Stravinsky and Richards Rodgers is programmed for the Sunday evening performance.

A symphonic scenario from the NBC television production "Victory at Sea" is on the agenda.

Beethoven is represented with his Symphony No. 7. Written in 1812, the Seventh is one of the few works of its kind with the second, usually slow, movement of the classic four-movement symphony marked allegretto, or somewhat less than fast but certainly not slow. Its bold and vigorous melodies led Richard Wagner to call it "the apotheosis of the dance." Beethoven said it was "one of my best."

Adding flame to the fireworks, the orchestra will play Stravinsky's "Firebird Suite." The Russian folk tale takes the listener into direct contact with the firebird. Musically, the tale depicts young Prince Ivan capturing the firebird, and upon releasing the bird, Ivan is rewarded a golden feather. Thus the adventure begins.

Opening the evening's concert is the overture to Verdi's "La Forza del Destino."

lino" (the force of destiny). The orchestra's regularly scheduled concerts begins at 7:30 p.m., and are held in the West Bloomfield High School auditorium, 4925 Orchard Lake.

Tickets are \$6 for adults and \$3 for students and senior citizens. Tickets may be reserved ahead of time by calling the symphony office, 626-1560. Any tickets which remain will be available at the door beginning at 6:30 p.m. before the performance.

Artists invited to submit drawings

Artists are invited to submit line drawings for publication in "The Artist's Coloring Book," to be published in late March.

The project is a joint venture of the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association and the Birmingham Society of Women Painters. The art association is the sponsoring organization and the Birmingham Society of Women Painters, the group that will produce the book which will be debuted at the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association book fair March 22.

Focus is on area artists. The title and artist's name will appear with each drawing and a short biography of each artist will appear in the appendix.

Any subject or style is acceptable and an editorial committee will make the final selections. Drawings must be in black and white and no gray or wash tones can be used because of the printing techniques. The book will be 12 inches square and the art works submitted should fit within this size or be capable of being enlarged or reduced to fit.

Art works should be in the office of the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association by Feb. 4. Office hours are 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday-Saturday. Mail to 1516 S. Cranbrook, Birmingham 48009.

All profits after printing costs will go to the Birmingham Bloomfield Art Association.

A limited edition of 1,000 copies, numbered in the front will be published and previewed at an artist's reception and autograph party.
