The Birmingham Village Players' next production is "You Can't Take It With You," a classic comedy by Moss Hart and George S. Kaufman. It will be presented Friday-Sunday, Jan. 18-20 and Friday-Saturday, Jan. 25-26. Ticket information is available by calling 644-2075. Curtain time is 8:30 p.m. with the exception of Jan. 20, when the Sunday performance will begin at 7:30 p.m.

The 57-year-old theater group, one of the oldest in the nation, performs at The Playhouse, Chester and Hunter Boulevard in Birmingham. In this current production, some cast members have been affiliated with Village Players for as little as six months and as long as 30 years. Here's a glimpse at the people who will perform in "You Can't Take It

With You" (itself a conglomerate of characters): John Hall, who portrays the Russian emigrant and ballet master, is a vice president for the United Foundation. Skip Pobst, who plays the inventor and fireworks expert, teaches. Priscilla Sommers, the lovely young daughter in the show, is a sales representative for National Cash Register. Don Jackson,

who plays the cockney boy friend, is in computer sales. Terry Iverson, who plays an IRS man, is a lawyer. Lindsay Balmer, the cockney cook and maid, is an assistant manager in retailing. Joyce Clouthier, who plays the part of the alcoholic actress, is actually in the conservative banking business. Howard Beer, the unforgettable Grandpa, is a financier.
