It's hard to imagine having a family of 30,000. But for the Ramallahs, being scattered throughout the United States does not mean the group isn't close.

close. The "Ramallah family" is a three-generation group of people whose elder members have immigrated to the U.S. since the late 1890s from Ramallah, Palestine, and have kept close contact with

Iah, Palestine, and have kept close contact with cach and every member.

Fred Harb, his wife Clair and their four children have made their home in Liyonia, along with more than 100 other families of the Ramallah clan.

Large groups of Ramallahs have also moved into homes in Westland, Redford Township, Birmingham, Farmington Hills, Garden City, Plymingth, and Dearborn, as well as other cities across the country.

"WE ARE proud to be Americans, but we are just as proud to be Palestinians," he said while his wife added, "America has treated our people very

wen.

To preserve the Arab culture and retain relationships with the Ramallah family members, the group has established a national federation and various local clubs.

The Detroit area club, which includes the Livonia The Detroit area club, which includes the Livonia residents, puts out a bi-monthly magazine entitled, "Hathihe Ramallah;" A national convention is held each year; and a directory is continually updated to include the names and addresses of all 30,000 members of the Ramallah family.

The 1980 national Ramallah convention will be held in Birmingham, Ala, where about 2,500 people are expected to attend.

"I know everyone in this book," Harb said, as he skimmed through the Ramallah directory. "If there is a death in the family, everyone knows about it; if there's a wedding, everyone comes," he said. "We had 600 people at our wedding 15 years ago and 500 just at the engagement party."

Harb said he worked odd jobs while putting himself through college at Wayne State University in Detroit and Detroit Institute of Technology.

He is now an engineer for Michigan Consolidated Gas Company,
Harb is actively involved in the Ramallah family and has served on the committees for the national conventions and has helped update the directory. Along with the Livonia Public Schools and a grant from the federal government, Harb has also collaborated on a book to teach secondary-school-age children about the culture, history and language of the Arab world.


