

O&E prep poll

Lahser cagers stay on top

Bloomfield Hills Lahser maintained its grip on first place in the Observer&Ecceentric area basketball poll for the second straight week.

But that hold was weakened by Birmingham Brother Rice, which posted one of the biggest upsets thus far of the basketball season in its 55-53 victory over Detroit Catholic Central.

Lahser, which tallied all three first-place votes from the O&E sports editors in the first week of the poll, got only two firsts this week. However, its total of 25 points kept it in the overall lead.

Rice is second with 23 points and one first place vote. Southfield remained in third (15 points), undefeated Orchard Lake St. Mary is fourth (12 points), Southfield-Lathrup is fifth (seven), Rochester Adams is sixth (five) and Rochester is seventh (four).

Rice's win over highly-regarded Catholic Central was the highlight of the local prep action. The Warriors lost their first two games this season but have since won five straight. Against Central, there were helped by the return of forward Rob Manilla, who missed the first six games with injuries.

Manilla played Central's All-State candidate Barry Spencer evenly for much of the contest, allowing him 19 points while scoring 15 himself. Rice held a 48-39 lead going into the final quarter, but CC scored the first eight points of the period to close it to 48-47.

CENTRAL EVENTUALLY took a 51-50 lead, but in the final seconds, with the score tied (53-53), Rochester's Brian Brennan carried one free throw and Judd Hart added two more to clinch the win.

Manilla's ability on defense will be a big plus for Rice during the remainder of the season. Brennan is the point guard (33 points) and six assists against Central) and sophomore Paul Jokisch (10 points vs. CC) and Hart (11 rebounds) join Manilla on the front line for coach Bill Norton.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

A Regular Meeting of the Farmington City Council was held January 7, 1980 in the Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan. The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. by Mayor William S. Hartsock.

PRESIDENT: Mayor Hartsock, **Councilmen:** Bennett, Tupper, Buckler and Yoder.

CITY OFFICIALS PRESENT: City Mgr. Deadman, Director Billing, Lt. Santanaro, Attorney Kelly and City Clerk Viane.

Minutes of the Previous meetings were approved. Minutes of other boards were received and filed.

A Public Hearing to review the proposed 1980-81 fiscal year Community Development Program was held. Council approved the proposed program.

Council received resolution from City of Novi regarding the SEMTA M-1 Plan. City Manager Deadman advised Council of the Region IV Michigan Municipal League Meeting on February 14, 1980 in Birmingham and the Michigan Municipal League Legislative Conference in Lansing on February 25, 1980.

The name of Mr. Yock Poy Lau was added to the list of applicants for the city's remaining Class "C" Liquor License.

A Proclamation was issued designating January 20-27, 1980 as "Jaycee Week."

Council approved wording to be included in the proposed ordinance amending the Zoning Ordinance with reference to Structure Heights.

City Manager Deadman submitted a progress report on the letting of a CATV franchise.

Council appointed Councilman Tupper and City Manager Deadman to serve on a CATV Franchise Review Committee and authorized funding of a consultant if the recommendation of the Review Committee is not accepted.

Council was advised that the Public Safety Command Officers have elected to be represented by the Transmitters State, County and Municipal Workers Local No. 214.

Council authorized the issuance of a Quit Claim Deed to Mr. Norman Paulson for that portion of Lots 6 and 7 Valleyhill Subdivision which he had deeded to the city for right-of-way purposes.

A resolution was adopted authorizing \$100.00 to the Citizens for Regional Water and Sewer System Committee and authorizing placement of petitions on the counters in the Municipal Building for citizens to sign towards this effort.

Council accepted the roadway named Hill View Court in the Hill View Subdivision and the water, sanitary sewer and storm system as constructed within the public easements.

Mr. James Wibby was appointed to serve as a city representative on the Farmington Community Library Board.

Mr. Edward M. Schwartz was appointed to serve as a member of the Farmington Canvassing Board.

City Manager Deadman was appointed as Legislative Coordinator to the Michigan Municipal League.

The Farmington Building Department Quarterly Report was received and filed.

The monthly bills were approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 p.m.

Of the teams rated in last week's poll, Adams and Rochester lost during the week. Adams was upended by Birmingham Groves in a Metro Suburban Association battle Friday, 50-49, and Rochester was dumped by Berkley, 60-52, last Tuesday.

Orchard Lake St. Mary's, the only unbeaten team in O poll, extended its streak to seven straight with a win over Ann Arbor Gabriel Richard, 63-54, Sunday in the Pontiac Silverdome.

In Friday's games, third-ranked Southfield trounced Birmingham Seaholm, 69-63, to up its record to 4-2, while Lathrup scored 29 first-quarter points to rip Royal Oak Dondoro, 77-65. And top-rated Lahser got a strong game from guard Tim Waun (21 points) to whip Troy Athens, 62-39.

The race for the O&E's top spot in the cage poll should be decided by Jan. 29. On that Tuesday, Lahser and Rice will meet in a game to be played at Rice. The Warriors haven't lost at home this season.

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
