With the hope of establishing a new record, the Detroit Women's Bowling Association is sending out a last minute call for entries for the annual tournament scheduled next month at Drakeshire Lanes.

When the entries close Friday it is hoped that they will pass the 1,000 mark and may even set a new record to surpass the 1,026 teams entered several years ago.

The women's city tournament is the largest city association event in the country and the Detroit group is anxious to hold on to that honor. So, if you haven't placed your entry, the time is now.

THE WAVE of 700 series seems to be growing higher by the week. The only reason claimed for the high scoring is the fact that the new lane finishes and the proper method to apply them has boosted the scoring.

The peak was reached again this week when five

members of the Little Caesar's Classic at Westland Bowl broke the barrier which gave them membership in the 700 club.

Dick Beattie set the pace when he linked games of 248, 267 and 214 for 729. Next came Frank Muggers with a middle game of 269 in 719 and a one-pin edge over Bob Jawor, who opened with a 256 for 718. Then came Jay Dishing with 703 and Bob Gukle Jr. with 700.

While this was going on, Jay Dishing's son, Jeff, missed the 700 mark by a mere three pins.

On the girl's side of the classic, Aleta Rzepecki was high with a 234 in 624 and Denise Bathum was next in line with 246 in 605.

Not to be outdone by the all-stars, John Hurley, who made a habit of 700 series last season, posted his 12th of the season with a 269 in 706 in the Monday league. Darryl Mogoon earned a

share of the spotlight by posting a 218 triplate.

OVER AT Farmington Lanes, Dave Hamilton, the rising young star, posted his 700 series of the season when he found the range for a 723 made possible by a 257 finishing game.

Other leaders in the high school league included Keith Guehrin with

660, John Ponke with 632, Harris McBride with 630 and Berry Van Dike with an even 600.

In the Tuesday mixed league, John Lapham earned membership in the 700 club with a closing game of 268 for 730.

LYNN MASSAE had the biggest thrill of her bowling career at Wood-

land Lanes when she ran up a string of seven strikes in the Flyers league before she missed and had to settle for a 245 in a 587 series. A 158 average bowler, she had only one open frame in her big game.

In the West Chicago men's league, Bill Morin was tops with a 267 for high-game honors. Ray

Cieslak took the series with a closing 254 in 684. Matt Smith, a sixth grader who is 11 years old, took the spotlight in the Father and Son league with a 224 game in his 528 series. His average is 144.

MARY MOHACSI was up for her old tricks in the doubles at Merri-Bowl.

With games of 188, 191 and 224, she set the pace with a 603. Next in line came Ruth Kinjorski with 599 and Virginia Lenk landed third with 598 in the closest finish of the season.

In the golden eagle loop, Herb Dolby was high with a 642, while in the senior citizens loop, Ed Snyder showed the

way with 590. John Holman was next with 577.

WITH A BIG middle game of 266, Bob Laffey took top honors in the men's league at Plaza Lanes with a 664. His closest rival was Steve Goron with 607.

IN OTHER good performances, Ken Radford missed her goal of a 200 game by a single pin.
