'Cuba' stays cool despite theme of high adventure

Melodramas seem to have gone out of fashion, yet their contents are literally the stuff that movies are made of — action, romance, adventure. One of the few current entries in that category is "Chba" (B). In addition to the usual ingredients, it offers some very dry British humor, striking photography and historical perspective on a major political event.

The parador of "Chba" is that in spite of all its excitement, it's a cool lilm, which perhaps accounts for the cool reception it seems to have received.

Richard Lester directed with a detachment that may be too sophisticated or an audience anticipating sex and violence with their romance and adventure. The film has these components, it simply doesn't dwell on them.

THE STORY IS set in Cuba in 1959, just as the Battista regime is toppling. Lester has the benefit of 10 years' distance, and he uses that advantage well. Neither the Castro rebels nor the regular army win any laurels. The government is corrupt, repressive and brutal. The Fidelistas terrorize and murder.

The moral (or immoral) position of both sides creates an interesting situation for the hero, Sean Connery. He plays a British officer, a specialist in counter-insurgent warfare from Malay, hired by the army to help them quash the rebels. It's too late for that. Nevertheless, Connery is there. The interesting facet of his character is his steadiness. He is not radicalized and won over to the rebel cause. Neither does he apologize for the Battista regime nor for his role as a mercenary. He is paid to do a do and, he emphasizes, he does his job for "any legitimate government." He's a man of principle.

Lester, far from moralizing, has a great deal of fun with the character and situation. When Connery, the gentleman, renew commence with an old flame, he discovers that each only is when they first met, not a respectable ir, as he acought. With typical underplaying, a stiffed phrase and startled expression tell us of his diction of the start of th

dicomfort at the revelation.

Brooke Adams plays the long-lost love, but not very well. She is a dreadful actress. Perhaps this explains an otherwise puzzling scene in which Connery abandons her in a rebel camp.

FORTURNATELY, others in the cast compensate for such shortcomings. Chris Sarandon is handsome and convincing as Adams philandering husband. Hector Eliziondo stands out as a loyal, beleagured army officer. Jack Weston is excellent as a gross American businessman trying to make a profit out of the chand Martin Balsam has fun with his role as a cunning and greedy

general.

Most impressive of all is the atmosphere which the film catches.
In an almost offnand way, impressions of an elegant dinner party, a
cigar factory, an urban slum present a vivid, if casual, documentayr of life in Cuba in 1959.

The warm colors, contrasts, and low-key humor make for an oddly interesting, hot/cool film.


