Unfortunately, the elder Cook was
unaware of a method to preserve newsprint and the edition was neatly folded
up and put into a drawer. Today, Cook
is almost afraid to unfold the frail network of yellowing newsprint. He
prefers to show visitors a photostat of
the original.

AMONG THE ARTICLES he's keep-ing for the historical society are a pic-ture of the Farmington Union School on the old site of Farmington Junior High

School.

The photo of Farmington Union School shows a solemn-faced line of elementary school students arrayed in front of the old school which burned down in 1918. The first owner of the photo neglected to jot down the year it was taken or the names of any of the

students.
But careful study of the flag shows
42 stars. Officially, the number of
states rose from 38 to 43 on July 4,
1890. July 4 is the traditional day when new states' stars were officially at-tached to the flag.

Evidently in 1889, Montana, Wash-ington, North Dakota and South Dakota were added to the Union. There weren't any more petitions to join the Union af-

ter those states were admitted so flag makers in late 1899 and early 1890 de-cided to get busy turning out flags with 42 stars. Then on July 3, 1890, idaho was admitted as the 43rd state. Nevertheless, some of the premature flags were sold and evidently one fluttered above Farmington Union School.

USING the flag as a clue, Cook deducts the pleture was taken somewhere between 1890-92. "They wouldn't get a new flag just because it was one star off," he says. The school bell of early Farmington educator Harry McCraken is also in the picture. The bell is a large, brass-bodied, wooden-handled instrument that doesn't need a public address system to be heard above the din of children at play.

The historical society acquired the bell in May 1978 from the McCracken

McCracken lived from 1865-1957. He served as a teacher in one-room school houses around Farmington. He was the district's first superintendent, from 1893-97.
