

Sophomore saves N. Farmington

Sophomore forward Tom Renard scored on a layup with one second left in the game to give North Farmington a 50-49 win over Redford Union Friday at Redford Union.

Renard's last-second heroics capped a furious fourth-quarter North

rally that brought the Raiders back from a 45-37 deficit after three quarters.

North led, 29-26, at the half but Redford Union put together a strong third quarter, outscoring the Raiders, 19-8.

The victory knocked the Panthers

out of a first-place tie with North and Livonia Franklin. Franklin won Friday, leaving it tied with North for the Northwest Suburban League lead with 9-1 records. RU is now 2-2.

Rex Baker led the Raiders with 11 points. Redford, Union got 16 points from Jerry Burk, 14 from Glen Roberts and 13 from Todd Hills.

North has a tough week ahead of it. The Raiders travel to Southfield for a game Tuesday, then battle Franklin (at Franklin) Friday. Both games start at 8 p.m.

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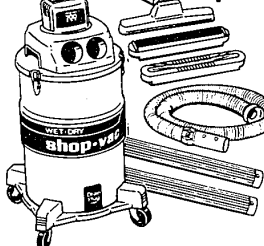

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS

CITY COUNCIL MEETING

JANUARY 14, 1980

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a regular meeting January 14, 1980 at 7:00 o'clock P.M. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting. Members present were Burwell, Laugs, Oppenheimer, Wolf, Alkateeb and Delan. Others present were City Manager Savage, Deputy City Clerk Thomas and City Attorney Bibeau. Council approved the minutes of November 19, November 26, December 10 and December 17, 1979.

An executive session was set for January 21, 1980 regarding a legal matter. Amendatory Ordinance C62-193 to rezone lots 8, 9 and N 15' of lot 10 of Park Hill Subdivision from RA-2 to OS-2 was enacted.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-194 to rezone lot 12 and the N 80' of lot 13 of Park Hill Subdivision in the SE 1/4 of Section 10 from RA-2 to OS-2 was enacted.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-AA was reintroduced to provide a new Industrial Research Office District Classification. Article XVA Section 1500, 1501A, 1502A, 1503A, 1504A, section 1507 Signs and Section 1514 walls and berms and amend Schedule of Regulation, Article XVIII Maximum height to 50'.

Cost Hearing for Meadowview of Pleasant Valley Farms water improvement was set for February 19, 1980 at 7:45 P.M.

Council accepted the Quarterly report of the Farmington Youth Assistance as presented by Patrick Prendergast.

The request to establish a six member Zoning Board of Appeals was approved. Council directed the Planning Commission to implement the results of the Advisory vote on RC-1, section of the Zoning Ordinance to recommend appropriate action relative to existing land so zoned.

A study session is planned for February 4, 1980 to develop the City owned Freedom-Drake property for Senior Citizen Housing. Commission on Aging to participate. It is an open meeting.

Council concurred the regular meeting of the City Council will be held the second and fourth Mondays of the month and the third Monday shall be public hearings unless otherwise posted; if the regular or public hearing meeting falls on a holiday the following day shall be considered the meeting day.

A special assessment district was established for Southbrook Water Improvement in Westgate Franklin Village Subdivision.

City Manager's recommendation to amend the City Code concerning mandatory sewer or connection was delayed until January 21, 1980, also the balance of the agenda will be considered at the regular meeting of the City Council to be held January 28, 1980. The delay was due to the lateness of the meeting.

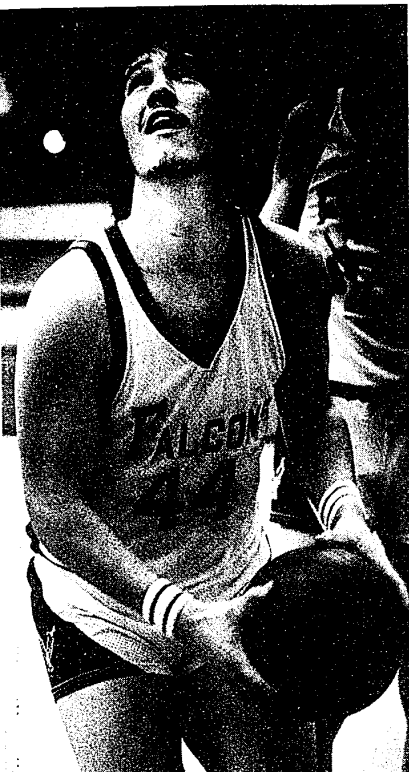
