

# OU women gain conference victory

The Oakland University women's basketball team beat Saginaw Valley over the weekend, 73-62. It was the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference opener for both teams. The Pioneers are 7-3 overall, 1-0 in the league.

Freshman guard Anne Kish, a Bloomfield Hills resident, scored 20 points to lead the Pioneers. All-American forward Helen Shereda played only 27 minutes because of a badly sprained left ankle, but produced 14 points and 10 rebounds.

Teresa VonDrasek and Lisa Crawford each scored 12 points. VonDrasek, a freshman forward from Okemos, grabbed a team-high 13 rebounds.

**OAKLAND, ONCE** the state's second-ranked team, dropped in the most recent poll released earlier this week. The Pioneers are ranked sixth in Michigan, behind the University of Detroit (11-3), Central Michigan (13-2), Western Michigan (12-5), Eastern Michigan (11-3) and Michigan State (7-6).

Wayne State University (7-5) and the University of Michigan (4-11) are ranked seventh and eighth, respectively.

**Technical foul leads to OU cage loss**

Rochester merchants were treated to an interesting basketball game Monday evening at the Hollie L. Lepley Building on the Oakland University campus.

Playing before a large and enthusiastic crowd on a promotion called "Rochester Night," the Pioneers lost in the closing moments to Grand Valley, 65-62.

The Pioneers are now 1-4 in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC), and 8-7 overall. Grand Valley improved its league mark to 2-3, and crept above .500 with a 9-9 overall record.

Unfortunately for the Pioneers, it was a bench technical which cost them their third straight loss.

With the score 59-57 in favor of Grand Valley, Oakland's Dan Rawlings was called for a backcourt foul after grabbing an offensive rebound. The OU

team, led by coach Lee Frederick, protested the call, and referee Don Edwards assessed the bench technical.

Mark Principe, a Bloomfield Hills Laker graduate, missed the one-on-one free throw opportunity awarded because of the backcourt foul. The senior guard then made one of the two technical shots to give the Lakers a three-point (60-57) lead.

Because of the technical, Grand Valley retained possession. Principe was fouled again, and made two shots for a five-point Laker lead.

The technical resulted in three Laker points, and a 62-57 lead, with only 1:03 remaining.

Oakland fought back, however. Substitute Bjorn Rossow made tipped one in, and Les Thomas hit a 36-footer from stage right to bring the Pioneers within two points.

Ed Moultrie and Mark Chechlik — another Laker graduate — made key free shots in the last 20 seconds to preserve the Laker victory.

Grand Valley made four-of-six free throws in the closing moments. For the game, Oakland made one more basket than Grand Valley (27-26), but the Lakers made 13 foul shots to Oakland's eight.

"I thought it (the technical) was a poor quality call," said Frederick, who was also handed a technical in a five-point loss last week to Hillsdale.

"At that stage of the game, you let the kids play, I just wondered how Rawlings could foul if he had the ball. Sure I felt bad about the situation. But I say in that type of game you let the kids play . . . the referees shouldn't call something like that."

"We worked hard preparing for this game, and we had a great crowd backing us up. It was not just our students, but a lot of other interested people from the community. They saw we have good, vibrant players."

Chechlik, a 6-foot-6-inch senior center, scored Grand Valley's first 10 points as the Lakers went ahead 10-3. Bill Peterson rallied the Pioneers with 11 points, as Oakland was down by only two points at the half, 32-30.

The game saw-sawed in the second half, with Oakland holding the lead on six different occasions. Its last advantage was 53-50 as Peterson finished off a nice three-point play.

The Lakers then scored the next six points — two baskets by Chris Chadwick and a lay-up by John Harrington — to take the lead for good.

Chadwick was the game's high scorer with 20 points. Chechlik had 16 points and nine rebounds, and Principe added 15 points.

Thomas led Oakland's scoring with 18 points, followed by Peterson with 16 and Rich Brauer with 13. Brauer, the team's leading scorer with an 18.4 average, also grabbed seven rebounds.

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING CITY OF FARMINGTON

The amendments will allow the City Council the option of holding public hearings on Zoning Ordinance Amendments.

### CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING JANUARY 21, 1980

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills held a special meeting January 21, 1980. Mayor Soronen opened the meeting at 7:30 o'clock P.M. Members present were Burwell, Lange, Oppenbuser, Wolf, Alkateeb, Dolan and late. Others present were City Manager Savage, Deputy City Clerk Thomas and City Attorney Donohue.

After the Public Hearing, the Council confirmed the Special Assessment Roll No. C107 in the amount of \$131,160 for the Briar Hill Road Improvement.

Amendatory Ordinance No. 62-195 to amend the Zoning Map to reflect OS-2 from RA-2 the south 85' of lot 10 and lot 11 of Park Hill Subdivision was introduced.

Amendatory Ordinance No. 62-196 was introduced to amend the Zoning Map by rezoning 22-21-351-018 in the SW 1/4 of Section 21, S. 45395 acres from L1-1 to B-3.

Amendatory Ordinance No. 62-197 was introduced to rezone lots 26 and 27 of Oakland Hills Orchard Subdivision from RA-2 to OS-2.

Amendatory Ordinance C62-X to amend the Farmington Hills Zoning Ordinance was introduced: Article IX-OS-1 and OS-1A Office Service Districts; Section 901 Principal Uses Permitted.

Amendatory Ordinance No. C63-Z, to amend the Farmington Hills Zoning Ordinance: Article XIX, General Provisions, Section 1902, Non-conforming Buildings and Uses was introduced.

Mayor Soronen proclaimed January 20 through 27, 1980 as Jayceek Week.

An executive session was called at the close of this special meeting to discuss litigation.

City Manager Savage's recommendation to introduce C-1-80, to amend the mandatory sewer ordinance to redefine the "availability" of sewers and to establish procedure for handling hardships resulting from mandatory connections was approved.

Council approved the concept of City Manager Savage regarding the procedure of granting franchise for Cable TV; joint approval of the Cities of Novi, Farmington and Farmington Hills re hiring a Consultant to recommend and submit proposals to the City Councils. West Bloomfield to be included if they so desire.

Council adopted the 1980 storm sewer program and authorized administration to proceed with the construction of Waldron Drain extension and proceed on preparation of Master Storm Drain Plan.

Upon motion the meeting adjourned.
