Cranbrook Academy of Art Museum — Historic fabrics from the collection of Gerhardt Knodel will be on exhibit through Feb. 24. Knodel, head of the academy of art's fiber department, is showing 65 pieces from 18th century to the present from areas such as India, Turkey, Indonesia and Africa. Included are garments, bed, wall and table coverings. The museum is open from 1-5 p.m. Tuesdays-Sundays. Admission is \$1.50, 500 Lone Pine, Bloomfield Hills.

CONTINUING SHOWS

D'Arcy-MacManus and Matus — Watercolors by Frederick Simper are on display at the in the West Gallery of the agency building, northwest corner of Long Lake Road and Woodward.

Slimper, who will retire as an artist with the agency, is a fine watercolor painter who paints scenes and wildlife in his beloved northern Michigan with an unusual sensitivity. The paintings will be there through Friday, Jan. 24.

Tweeny's Cafe — A photographic exhibit by Darryl Pitt and Andy Freeberg will be shown through Feb. 9. "On Stage, Live!" displays photos of performers from the 1979 Montreux Jazz Festival in Switzerland, Pine Knob and more. The cafe is on the lower level at 280 N. Woodward.

Detroit Institute of Arts — "Treasures of Ancient Nigeria" will be on exhibition through March 16. Detroit is the first city on the cross-country tour of these beautiful pieces from the Nok Culture (500 B.C. to 200 A.D.). This is
