Bobo Jenkins has been singing the blues for more than a half-century, and come the Winter Carnival he will be singing them in Birmingham.

Ron Kovacs, who brought the Bloomfield Theatre back to life 14 weeks ago, is delighted by the prospect of Jenkins' anopearance.

"I had some calls asking me if I was putting out a political song," he said. He didn't realize he was, at the time, Jenkins now declares. But the song was "a smash hit."
