Ms. Pitzgerald, whose book "Fire in the Lake" is a comprehensive history of the Vietnam war, has recently turned for attention toward a study of social science textbooks used in elementary and secondary education.

In her most recent book, "America Revised," Pitzgerald notes that on an average of every five years textbook accountings of history change to accommodate the thinking of the times and whims of the marketplace.

"What sells best goes into the text," she says, adding that this has been a trend in American textbooks for the past 50 years.

The keynote address will open the conference on Thursday evening. It will

be followed by a discussion on the Michigan Textbook Study by John M. Chapman, social studies specialist of the Michigan Department of Education.

Friday's program includes a panel discussion on "The Role of Publishers in Improving Social Studies Instruction." Representatives from four major bublishing houses, Allyn and Baeon, Inc., Scott. Foresman and Company, McGraw-Hill, and Houghton Miffiin Company will be on hand for discussions.

Houseplants don't need Canadian visa anymore

If you are traveling between Michigan and Canada, you are no longer required to have plant insect pest and disease-free certification of house plants, issued by the Michigan Department of Agriculture, according to Dean M. Pridgeon, director.

FOR INSTANCE, prior to this agreement, household goods containing house plants being transported from Michigan through Canada to New York, had to have all plants inspected and certified pest-free by MDA before entering Canada, Pridgeon said.

This exemption agreement does not apply to nursery stock or commercial shipments of any kind or size, nor to plants from any origin other than the continental United States and Canada

"It has been apparent for several years that individual house plants were in a low risk category, and I'm pleased this arrangement has been reached. This eliminates red tape, and simplifies travel between the two countries," Pridgeon said.


