OCC cagers fall

Oakland Community College's basketball team didn't extend its winning streak very far.

Schoolcraft Community College scored the first three baskets of the second half to improve its lead to 10 points (38-28) and OCC's Raiders couldn't catch up, as they fell, 67-53, Saturday at Schoolcraft.

OCC, which had lost five straight games in the Eastern Conference of the Michigan Community College Athletic Association, broke that streak last Wednesday with a win over Detroit Henry Ford.

But the Raiders, who had won seven straight league games before the losing skid, couldn't keep the new streak alive in the Schoolcraft game.

Poor shot selection and costly turnovers again plagued OCC. The Raiders forsaken their inside game, instead put-

ting up low-percentage outside jump shots. Part of OCC's problem was an injury to pivotman Kevin Threlloff which limited his playing time.

Anthony Barnard was top scorer for the Raiders with 12 points. Darryl Claussell and Jeff DeYoung each contributed 10. Lathrup was led by Mike Brady's 16 points, with Norman Williams adding 14 and Dennis Freeman 10.

OLSM 5 win

Orchard Lake St. Mary's, behind an outstanding all-around performance by sophomore guard Don Butcher, got it rolling early and never stopped in a 96-63 win over Redford St. Agatha Tuesday at St. Agatha.

Butcher, in his second season as one of the team's co-captains, poured in 19 points, passed off for 12 assists and made eight steals to ignite OLSM.

The Eagles ran up a 23-14 advantage after one quarter. St. Agatha got back to within two, 25-23, with a 9-2 scoring burst at the start of the second period.

But OLSM put it away after that, outscoring the Aggies 21-6 in the remainder of the half for a 46-29 halftime lead.

The Eagles stayed in command with

a 50-34 scoring margin in the final two quarters.

Ten players scored in the contest for the Eagles. Carl Pellegata came off the bench to pump in 18 points for OLSM, including eight in the final quarter. Pellegata connected on eight of nine floor shots.

Also scoring in double figures for St. Mary's was Don Smeznik (13 points) and Ed Okuniewski (10). Okuniewski had seven rebounds.

St. Agatha's Kevin Cotter led all scorers with 20 points. Al Jones had 16, Mike Skiver 12 and John Werth 11. Jones collected 14 rebounds in the contest.

OLSM hit on 38 of 73 field goal attempts (52 percent) to 35 of 55 (64 percent) for St. Agatha's. OLSM held the edge in rebounding, 41-32.
