

Groves cagers beaten

Rochester High School's basketball team snapped a three-game losing streak with a 59-48 victory over Birmingham Groves Tuesday evening.

Groves was ahead 26-22 at half-time, but Rochester rallied in the second half for the win. Groves is now 5-6 for the season, and Rochester is 7-5.

"We took over in the second half," said Rochester coach John Bailey. "It was a close game until about the three-minute mark, then we went

ahead by three. At that point we went into a zone defense. And, we made all of our foul shots at the end which really helped."

Rochester, a member of the Greater Oakland Activities League (GOAL), made all 10 of its free throws in the last quarter. For the game Rochester made 19-25 free throws for a fine 76 percent average.

Chris Ribant scored a career-high 31 points by making 10 baskets and 11 of 21 free throws. The senior forward also led Rochester with eight rebounds.

Dana Brault, a senior center, scored 10 points.

Chris Atkinson led Groves with 15 points, and Al Campbell added 13. Groves was outscored 14-24 in the fourth quarter.

Rochester will play tomorrow evening at home against West Bloomfield. Groves plays tomorrow at Royal Oak Dondero.
