Music series runs Mondays at U-M—Dearborn

The Monday Night Free Concert Series at the University of Michigan—Dearborn, is a combination of music, dance and visual arts.

The concert series is sponsored by the Cultural Events Committee, whose objective is to bring to U-M-D students and the metropolitan Detroit community excellent performers who represent a wide variety of art.

In the past the concert series has included classical music, jazz, ragtime, medieval music and contemporary works. This semester for the first time, a solo dance repertory and a multi-media night will be included.

Each concert is free and takes place

on the U-M-D campus at the Fair Lane Conference Center.

MONDAY NIGHT The Winter Series was kicked off by jazz-singer Gwyn Shepherd. On Feb. 4 it will continue with the Ann Arbor Brass Quintet who will perform pieces by 17th, 18th and 20th century composers.

On Feb. 18 the Student Activities Organization is co-sponsoring a multi-media night in the Recreational Organizations Center with the Cultural Events Committee. Artists John R. Degroot, Gerhard Schlenky and The Mirage Dance Collective will present a visual performance piece called "Terraqueous Incantation," which will involve

dancers, projected images, special lighting, props and accompanying sound effects.

The second half of the multi-media show will feature Richard Jennings and his original composition "Space Opera 1: As We Travel Through the Stars," which is a one-act opera for solo performer, utilizing voice, tape, live electronics, projected light scenery and effects.

March 31, Ginka Gerova-Ortega and Chris Birg will perform works for flute and guitar by Bach, Handel, and Ravel. The Winter Concert Series will conclude with a performance of Solo Dance Repertory with artists Gay

Dalange, Lynn Rosenfeld and Elizabeth Bergmann accompanied by Percy Danforth on bones and Eric Maddox on Piano.

THE CONCERT April 7 will feature a recently premiered dance by Gay Delange called "Motor Tango."

At the live performances in the Fair Lane Conference Center, members of the audience can get involved with the music, the performing techniques of the musicians and the individual personality of each artist.

Hudson's gives museum grant

The J.L. Hudson Company has awarded the Toledo Museum of Art a grant of \$10,000 to encourage broad participation in the museum's education programs.

A year's survey of community awareness is designed to produce a plan to increase participation of students from neighborhoods not traditionally involved with the Saturday classes and other programs thus improving the demographic

balance in the programs and more effectively reflecting the whole Toledo community.

The J.L. Hudson Company has a location in the Franklin Park Mall of Toledo. Hudson's grant to the museum is the largest award made to any organization in the Toledo area.

The museum is open Tuesday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sunday hours are 1-5 p.m. The museum is closed on Monday, and holidays.

Opera theatre names director

The Michigan Opera Theatre (MOT) has named Stefanie T. Ott-O'Toole as its first full-time director of development.

Funding for the position became available due to a \$100,000 grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation.

According to David DiChiera, MOT general director, the funding is part of the foundation's assistance program to help 12 major regional opera companies develop ways to increase their earned and contributed income over a three year period.

"We must recognize," DiChiera said, "that MOT's success at the box office can not provide sufficient funds to cover our operating costs. Nor are funds available from earned income to provide a stable financial base for MOT's Artist-Interns program, statewide Opera-In-Residence program, and the In-School Educational program."

"WE MUST," he said, "bridge the gap between ticket sales and the enormous expense of producing opera in these inflationary times by strengthening our private and corporate support. Receiving this grant could be a major turning point in MOT's development."

The Mellon Foundation, based in New York, is one of the 10 largest in the United States. Incorporated in 1969, the foundation is noted for its philanthropic contributions.

Lynn Townsend, chairman of MOT's board of trustees, expressed the board's appreciation for the foundation's "recognition of the status MOT has achieved over the past nine years and their faith in our future."

AS DEVELOPMENT director, Mrs. Ott-O'Toole will work closely with DiChiera, the MOT board and Richard Johnson, director of finance, in the planning, development, and administration of all areas of fund raising, including individuals, businesses, government, and foundation.

Mrs. Ott-O'Toole has served as assistant to former Oregon Senator, Wayne Morse, and personal assistant to Michigan Congressman William D. Ford. She was associated with Gimbel's of New York as assistant manager of executive development. Recently, she served as a marketing representative with one of Johnson & Johnson's pharmaceutical companies and in government relations on the corporate staff.

'End of Summer' arrives on U-M campus

It may be the middle of winter but Feb. 6-9 at the University of Michigan Trueblood Theatre it's the "End of Summer."

U-M's Department of Theatre and Drama Showcase Series will present S.N. Behrman's comedy in Ann Arbor.

"End of Summer" is a stylish play set in and written during the depths of the Depression. The humorous social conflicts of a flirtatious heiress and her guests make this play the author's personal favorite.

BEHRMAN, best known for his plays "No Time for Comedy" and "Fanny," is frequently called the "American Shaw" because of the style and charm of his dialogue. "End of Summer" was selected as one of the best plays of the 1930-37 theatre season.

Stage direction is by Martin E. Friedman, a Ph.D. student and coordinator of the university's Studio Theatre. Friedman's recent directing credits include "Robin Goodfellow," a children's play, and Thornton Wilder's "Our Town."

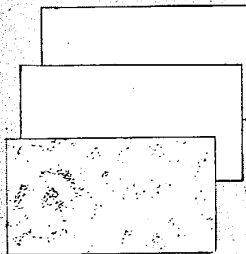
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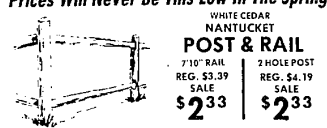


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
