Knodel, head of the academy of art's fiber department, is showing 65 pieces from 18th century to the present from areas such as India, Turkey, Indonesia and Africa. D'Arcy-MacManus and Masius — Watercolors by Frederick Simper are on display at the West Gallery of the agency building, northwest corner of Long Lake Road and Woodward. 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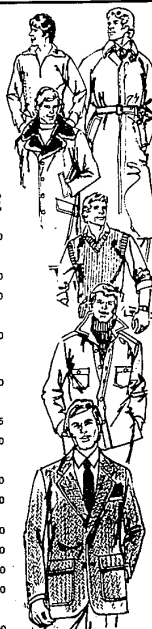
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
