

## NF spikes Farmington; Mercy records 5th win

North Farmington's volleyball team "hadn't been playing very good," according to coach Sandy Lubieniecki. Until last Friday, anyway.

It was on Friday that the Raiders "snapped out of it" according to Lubieniecki, and it was crosstown rival Farmington that suffered the consequences by losing two straight games, 15-0, 15-9, to North.

"We had a team meeting Thursday before practice," Lubieniecki said. "Our skill level was good, but we lacked intensity."

No lack of intensity was evident against Farmington. The Raiders dominated throughout the match, and Farmington has been having its problems of late, though. After getting clobbered by North, the Falcons competed in the Plymouth Invitational Saturday. They won their first game against Walled Lake Western, 15-6, and led in the second, 10-4, before the roof caved in.

Western rallied for 10 straight points in the second game on 10 straight serves and ended up splitting the two games with Farmington.

"After that, everybody started beating us," said Falcon coach Ron Shortt. Farmington failed to win another game in its pool. Lack of intensity seems to be contagious among

Farmington's volleyball teams, since that seemed to be what was ailing the Falcons.

"WHEN YOU'RE beating everyone, you get the idea you got it made," Shortt explained. "It tells them it takes a minimum of seven of eight players to effectively cover the volleyball court area."

"Since we can only use six, I tell them we got to hustle to make up for the lack of that one player. That's what we haven't been doing."

The moves paid off Monday against Milford Lakeland, as Farmington came back from a one-game deficit to win, 11-15, 15-10, 15-10. The victory improved the Falcons' record to 5-2 in the Inter Lakes League and 7-3 overall.

North also took part in the Plymouth Invitational, with better success than Farmington. The Raiders finished third in their section by winning six of their 10 games. However, North went against Westland John Glenn in the first playoff

match and lost, 15-9, 15-9.

The Raiders are now 2-3 in the Northwest Suburban League.

In other volleyball action, Farmington Our Lady of Mercy improved its Catholic League record to 5-2 with a 15-10, 15-7 victory over Harper Woods Regina Monday.

The league, according to Mercy coach Linda Barber, remains "pretty well balanced," with several teams in contention for the championship.

One of those teams is defending champ Birmingham Marian, which is Mercy's opponent tonight at Marian.

North plays at Garden City East Monday, while Farmington plays Wednesday at Pontiac Northern.

Orchard Lake St. Mary's college team battled state basketball power Siena Heights College for the first half of their contest last Saturday.

But the young Eagles couldn't match their opponents firepower in the second half, as Siena Heights rolled to a 82-57 victory.

OLSM jumped out to the early lead and had a 10-point bulge midway through the opening period. But Siena Heights, a Catholic school located in Adrian, scored the last six points of the

first half to grab a 39-38 advantage at intermission.

Any upset hopes the Eagles entertained quickly faded in the first minutes of the second half. OLSM turned the ball over four straight possessions and Siena Heights scored all four times to build up a nine-point lead (47-38). OLSM could never overcome that margin.

"After that (four turnovers in a row) we had to play catch-up," OLSM coach Tim Domke said. "And that's just not our game."

"It's very disappointing. We didn't get a strong game from our guards."

Scot Miller and Scot Glidden, who started for the Eagles at the guards, suffered through poor shooting nights. Miller connected on just one of three shots and finished with two points; Glidden hit on two of 10 attempts and scored only four points.

Domke got a sound game from pivotman Martin Eddy, who led OLSM with 16 points. Forward Eddy Barrett came off the bench to contribute 11 markers and Aaron Hardaway scored 10.

Siena Heights was led by D'von Wimberly with 22 points. Dan Terrault had 18, Tyrone Richardson 14 and Al Sandifer 10.

Siena Heights hit on 34 of 75 field goal attempts (45 percent). Siena Heights also controlled the boards, collecting 45 rebounds to 36 for the Eagles.

The loss dropped OLSM to 6-14. Siena Heights, the team Domke thinks is a shoe-in to get the independent bid for the state tournament, stands at 10-4.

The Eagles next game is at home against Mercy College tonight at 7:30 p.m.

## Athletic director promoted

Eugene V. Reilly, a Farmington Hills resident, has been appointed to the position of executive director of external affairs recently for the Detroit Country Day School in Birmingham.

Mr. Reilly will be responsible for the operation of financial development, public relations, alumni relations and the athletic departments for all four schools: preschool, lower, middle and upper.
