Rev. Lester Kinsolving's Religion Update

A new book, written by an Episcopal bishop and described as "an ecclesiastical Peyton Place," features California's Gov. Ronald Reagan as one of the "real characters," according to the author, the Rt. Rev. Chandler Sterling.

But, says the 59-year-old resigned bishop of Montana, "Nobody will know where he appears" in the book, "The Holyrold Papers," released this week by Bartholomew House.

Bishop Sterling and the California governor were boyhood friends in Illinois.

"We shared a girl friend," he recalls. "One night Reagan asked if I could borrow my dad's car and drive him to Davenport, Iowa, for a radio announcer's award. Well, I had more important things to do, I had a date that night so he hitchhiked out there and got the job."

THE BISHOP's first novel tells the story of Jim Holyrold, who enters the ministry as the

result of guilt over the suicide of a college roommate. The story of his eventual election as bishop includes church politics, alcoholism, dishonest business dealings, blackmail and a substantial amount of sex.

"The book is not primarily pornographic," says Bishop Sterling. "Sex is one of the elements in it because sex is one of the elements in life."

He is presently working on a part time basis in the administration of confirmation and ordination in the diocese of Pennsylvania.

Of his sexy novel he says: "I wrote it for money; so that I can have sufficient income to write what I want to, in a lifetime of trying to bring the church into the 20th century."

Class Goes Creative For Christmas Sharing

Silk screen frames lined the long table, with teens busily applying paint over the holiday designs.

Stacks of completed Christmas cards were piled at one end.

On the nearby blackboard could be found the accounting: 550 Santas, 205 angels, 100 wise guys.

The scene was a class room in St. Gerald Catholic School, Farmington, and the teens were senior high students from Stevenson High School, Livonia, and Farmington High.

ALL ARE members of the senior high religion class taught at St. Gerald by Ted Hengesbaugh, a Ford Motor Co. production control man who started the group three years ago with just four students.

Now the class numbers about 30, Hengesbaugh said, and its members decided this fall they would like a special Christmas project.

"They wanted to put the Christmas charity we talk about into action," he added.

A PARTY FOR some less fortunate was with the teens. That took money, so they considered ways to raise it.

There was a suggestion that they might sell Christmas cards, and that led to the idea of making their own cards to sell.

So, Hengesbaugh said, several of the students, including Pam Tykoski and Donna Greiner of Farmington and Mike Davidson and Chris and Greg Melochio of Livonia, began work on the cards.

Other leaders in the project have been Andy Alld, Carla Whinnery, Nancy Kall and Elaine Chavot, all of Farmington.

Nearly all the class has taken some part in two weekends of work to produce the cards.

There will be six designs on the outside and six different greeting messages on the inside.

Many of the cards will be printed on metallic paper.

"WE'VE PUT about \$60 into materials so far and are planning to spend about \$25 more," the teacher said. "We'd like to raise about \$300."

Most of the cards will be sold in boxes of 15 for \$17.50. The
