

# Lecture series announces season

Pontiac-Oakland Town Hall's 1980-81 lecture series will open Oct. 15 with Marlo Thomas.

Ms. Thomas was known as Danny Thomas's daughter and also became a top rated TV star in her own right as "That Girl." She left the show in the '70s to expand her horizons both professionally and sociopolitically.

She has been in plays, movies, produced and starred in TV specials and has become a writer. She has won many awards for these accomplishments.

She has long been an advocate of the ERA. She is a member of the Advisory Board of the Women's Political Caucus. Shirley Eder, nationally syndicated gossip columnist, will speak Nov. 12. She is a regular on the Channel 2 p.m. news every Tuesday and any other night whenever she has something to say. Shirley is also a frequent guest on the "Mike Douglas" show, "Dinah Shore" and other talk programs. She is a Southfield resident, and her column

appears in the Detroit Free Press.

The new year opens with Martin Agronsky on Jan. 14, 1981. Agronsky has won television's three most coveted awards and is known internationally as one of its most influential and knowledgeable correspondents and interviewers.

HE HAS REPORTED and analyzed critical news events and developments since World War II, first as a war correspondent in Europe, North Africa, the Middle East and the Pacific for NBC, then as a Washington correspondent for ABC.

Agronsky hosts a weekly news discussion program, "Agronsky and Company," for CBS Washington.

Elisa Celli will tell secrets of low-calorie cooking Feb. 11. Ms. Celli is being hailed by the media as "the new High Priestess of Cuisine" for developing fine Italian dishes that are delicious, nutritious and, above all, low in calories.

Her new book, "Naturally Italian," is crammed with gourmet recipes, many of which are original, thereby opening up a new world of taste and enjoyment for dieters.

Ms. Celli is hostess-producer-writer of the ABC network television series, "Great Foods of the World." In addition to "Naturally Italian," she is author of "Quick and Easy Gourmet Foods" and "Elisa Celli's 15-Minute Gourmet Cooking."

She is a contributing editor of House Beautiful and a feature writer for Gourmet, Cue, Ladies' Home Journal, New York Magazine and Cosmopolitan. In addition she has been written up in Mademoiselle, Vogue and Harper's Bazaar.

PONTIAC-OAKLAND Town Hall will close the 1980-81 series March 11, with Charles Osgood, CBS anchorman. He is perhaps best known for his daily radio news program "Newsbreak." Because he does some of these morn-

ing offerings in verse, Osgood has been dubbed "poet in residence" at CBS. Some of these pieces are being published by Holt Rinehart and Winston in a book called "Nothing Could Be Finer Than a Crisis That Is Minor in the Morning."

Osgood regularly anchors hourly news broadcasts on the CBS Radio Network and the "Newsbreak" programs in the morning. With vast audiences reached by these programs, his voice has become of the best known and listened to in the United States, with a daily listenership of more than eight million.

The lectures are held on Wednesday mornings at 10:30 a.m. at Roma of Bloomfield in Bloomfield Hills.
