OLSM wins division championship

Basketball insiders say it takes experience to learn how to handle the pressure situations.

But with each game of the prep season, Orchard Lake St. Mary's makes a mockery out of that belief.

OLSM came up with a big fourth quarter, outscoring Wyandotte M. Carmel 12-4, to wrap up the Catholic C-D League's West Division championship with a 49-44 win Friday at Orchard Lake.

It was the Eagles' 15th straight victory without a loss this season. OLSM has won 30 straight regular season league contests over the past three seasons. The team's last loss was in state regional competition last year against Redford St. Mary's.

Pressure seems to have no effect on the young, talented Eagles. Only one junior starts on the team, along with three sophomores and a freshman.

"These kids are all young but they're handling pressure really well," OLSM coach Bob Shoemaker said after the victory. "They believe in themselves and the coaching staff believes in them."

The Eagles had a 28-21 lead at the half but M. Carmel, whose only league loss came against OLSM earlier in the season, rallied in the third period for a

19-9 scoring advantage and a 40-37 lead.

But OLSM came back behind key baskets by sophomores Don Butcher and Hiram Harris and freshman Dave Montgomery. Montgomery "had a great game on defense and he came up with some key rebounds," Shoemaker said.

Harris, who sat out the end of the third quarter and the beginning of the fourth with four personal fouls, led OLSM with 12 points. Butcher added six of eight floor shots. Butcher added 11 points and Ed Okuniewski, who as a junior is the elder statesman on the

team, scored nine points and had 12 rebounds.

M. Carmel's Jeff Szczechowski led all scorers with 13 points. Bruce Szczechowski contributed 11 markers.

OLSM hit on 19 of 55 field goal attempts (34.5 percent) to 17 of 51 for M. Carmel (33 percent). M. Carmel out-rebounded the Eagles, 38-36.

The Catholic League playoffs are next for OLSM. The team's first contest is against Marine City Holy Cross Tuesday at 8 p.m. at Calihan Hall on University of Detroit's campus. Six Mile Road and Livonia.

OCC falls again

Flint Mott clinched the Michigan Community College Athletic Association Eastern Conference's title by overpowering Oakland Community College, 92-71, last Wednesday at Mott.

Mott's title victory broke an OCC string of four years of dominance in the league. OCC, which had won its first seven league contests this season before slipping, saw its conference record dip to 9-9.

Ragged officiating marred the Mott win. Anthony Barnard, who led OCC with 21 points, had two baskets disallowed. The first came after an offensive foul on teammate Phil Booknight and the second because the officials didn't see the ball go through the hoop.

The Raiders were assessed 27 personal fouls in the contest and three technicals - two on coach Tom McPhillips and another on Darryl Claussell. Booknight and John James fouled out for OCC.

Lamar Edwards paced the potent Mott attack with 25 points. Kevin Strizer netted 22. Pete Floyd had 17 and Litus Ferguson 12.

Claussell joined Barnard in double figures with 20 points for OCC.

The Raiders, who sport a 12-13 overall record, are in the midst of their worst season in years. McPhillips, who has produced five league championships in his 10 seasons as OCC coach, is now rumored to be leaving after the conclusion of this season.

Despite the team's poor showing in the second half of the season, OCC will still participate in the state tournament. The first game from Jackson will be broadcast on 90.2, WORF-FM, OCC's student radio station, on Feb. 26. Greg Raymond will handle the play-by-play and Steve Balcon, OCC's sports information director, will do the color commentary.

The Raiders final regular season contest is Wednesday at Delta, starting at 8 p.m.
