St. John's Armenian Church — A group of paintings by Nounoufar Roghossian, folk artist, will be on exhibit in the church's cultural hall through Feb. 27. Born in 1894, the artist began to paint in 1946. Since then she has had shows in California, Spain, and Yerevan in the Soviet Union. Her work has been included in the 1975 UNESCO calendar, in the Whitney Museum, in the books "20th Century American Folk Art" and "Art and Artists" by Julia Weissman and Herbert W. Hemphill Jr. and is the subject of a TV documentary. The church is at 22001 Northwestern, Southfield.

Troy Public Library — Watercolors by Shirley Binard of Troy can be seen through Feb. 29. The artist attended Michigan State University, American Academy of Art, Center for Creative Studies and studied under Charles Reid. The library is just east of I-75 on Big Beaver at Civic Center Drive. Galerie de Boisicourt — "The Arts of Africa and Haiti" will be at the gallery in the Fisher Building through March 15.
