UPON COMPLETING the qualifications for certification, you are eligible to teach, write for publication, assist in personnel selection work, lecture, analyze a writer's personality in depth, or any other way you choose to promote the professionalism of this discipline.

Summer of 1980 is going to be very exciting time for all serious handwriting analysts. Major schools of handwriting analysis and graphology will all meet together at Carthage College to join in one organization to be known as the Council of Graphological Societies — COGS for short.

## These athletes really push

Take a handful of lima bean seeds or other large and fast-growing seeds. Soak them overnight in water.

Line a jewelry box or small shoebox with foil. If

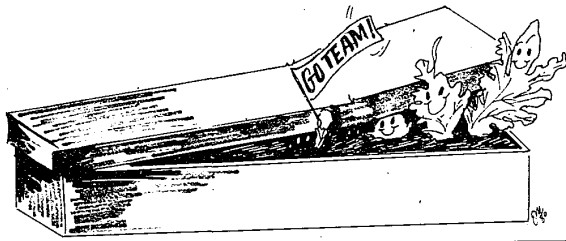
a shoe box is used, crumple some additional foil and put it in the box. This will act as additional fill as well as drainage. Fill the box to the top with potting soil.

Now press the water-soaked seeds one by one into the soil, spreading them evenly around the center of the box. Moisten the soil thoroughly with water, cover with plastic wrap and put the lid on the box.

The plastic wrap will prevent the soil from drying out.

NOW COMES the wait. In just a few days, the power of the seedlings will push the box top right off. You can call it the desire to succeed, and the push to the top is shown graphically.
