**Concert band to perform**

The Oakland University Concert Band will present a free family concert at 3 p.m. Sunday in Varner Recital Hall on campus near Rochester.

Detroit baritone Davis Gloff will narrate "Tubby the Tuba."

The concert ensemble is under the direction of James Dawson, associate professor of music. The selections include familiar melodies like "La Procession Du Rocio" by Joaquin Turina and "Polka and Fugue" from the opera "Schwanda, the Bagpiper" by Jaromir Weinberger.

Soloist George Kleinsinger and Gloff will be featured in the "Tubby the Tuba" number. Gloff, a lyric baritone, has appeared in opera, oratorio, concert and recital performances.

A highlight of the concert will be the performance of the "Concerto for Trombone and Band" by Nicholas Rimsky-Korsakov. Soloist will be Steven DeDoe, a junior from Kalamazoo and a winner of this year's concerto competition at OU.

The work was first performed March 16, 1878, with the composer at the podium. It has become one of the important pieces in the trombone repertoire.
