

Prutow, McGlinchy seek school board re-election

Two incumbents will seek re-election to four-year terms on the Farmington Board of Education in the June 9 school election.

Board secretary Helen Prutow, who'll complete a four-year term in June, announced her intentions during last week's board of education meeting. "It's been an enjoyable four years and I'd like another four," said Mrs. Prutow.

Prutow, of Farmington Hills. She served as president of the seven-member board during the 1978-79 school year.

Board trustee James McGlinchy confirmed Thursday that he also will run again.

"I haven't taken out petition forms yet. But tentatively yes, I plan to run," McGlinchy said in a telephone interview.

A personnel-labor relations director

at Wayne County General Hospital, McGlinchy was appointed to the board two years ago to fill the seat of Dr. Mervyn Ross, who resigned in the middle of a four-year term.

McGlinchy, the only trustee who lives in Farmington, was then elected last June to complete the final year of Ross' term.

No other candidates have announced plans to run in the June election. Challengers have until April 7 to qualify.

Nominating petitions are available at the school administration building, 32500 Shawwassee. Candidates must acquire names of 20 registered voters on filing petitions.

School personnel will furnish candidates with filing and campaign finance law information from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

One must be a registered voter in the Farmington school district, but not necessarily a property owner to run for office.

Nominating petitions will be available after March 15 at the George Bee Administration Center, 2480 Opdyke, in Bloomfield Hills.

Candidates must acquire a minimum of 50 names on nominating petitions, be a registered voter and a resident of Oakland County to run for a seat on the OCC board.

TO VOTE in the election residents of the school district, which includes all of Farmington, Farmington Hills and the southern portion of West Bloomfield, must register by 5 p.m. May 12.

Also on the June ballot, voters will elect three candidates to six-year terms on the Oakland Community College board of trustees.

Watch who's selling GOP paraphernalia

Merchants and restaurant owners should be wary when purchasing space in publications purporting to represent the Civic Host Committee, the Detroit based group in charge of welcoming the Republican National Convention.

The Host Committee has received several complaints from businesspersons who thought they were buying advertising space in an official publication, according to the committee's executive director Carol J. Gies.

One of the publications is soliciting merchants for black and white ads at a cost of about \$500. Color advertising is offered, too.

Several persons have told the committee that they were offered advertising space in publications which would be offered to delegates in their hotel or motel.

"They didn't arrange with the hotels to do that (give the publications to the delegates as they registered). We have the full right to do that," she said.

Other complaints have involved a group compiling a restaurant guide, implying it was the host committee's official list.
