(Continued from page 1B) peers out over the room. "She's a friend our ours," Mrs. Henderson said, smiling. "We think she may be from Pennsylvania around the early part of the 18th century. At least we found her in Pennsylvania." Henderson later confirmed the unsigned painting was done around 1830 and came from Kingston, N.Y. Mrs. Henderson said she's also fond of Shaker pieces but they are quite expensive and difficult to find. For most families, a trip to the neighborhood shopping mall or a movie might make a happy weekend, but for the Hendersons, they would more likely wind up at Greenfield Village.

"EVEN MATTHEW is interested in antiques," Mrs. Henderson said. "He is very proud of his room and keeps it very neat." But she admitted that inside antique cupboards there are stored "Star Wars" books and other materials that are right up to the minute. At Chrystmasteime the Hendersons did their tree all in apples and candles. "Those were the first things ever put on a tree," Mrs. Henderson said. "It looked just charming." They also wrapped their gifts in blue and white hand-woven fabric just like the homespun used by early settlers. Henderson said his Mulberry Hill Antiques and Furniture Refinishing firm specializes in 18th and 19th century country primitives. "There are so many kinds of antiques and so many fields that you simply have to concentrate and specialize on something," he said. A special dream of both Hendersons is to someday be able to buy a plot of land large enough to build an authentic old village on it. "We'd like to develop a complete community of people who would live as people lived 200 years ago," Mrs. Henderson said. Though they don't have a time machine, they do nurture that dream and in a small way have made it come true in their own home.

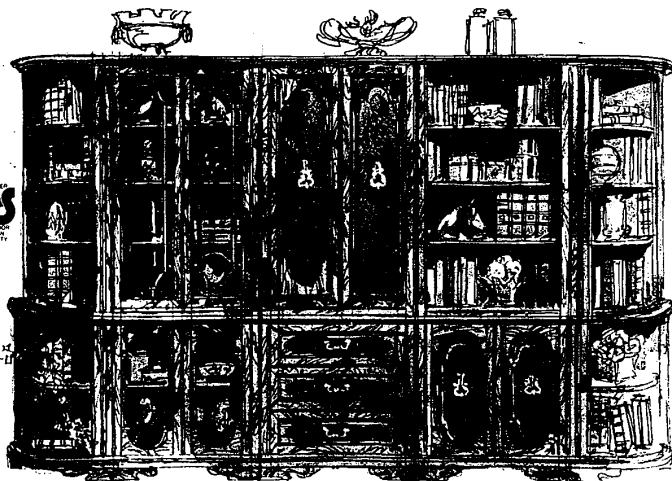
