CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS Summary of Proceedings City Council Meeting January 22, 1979

The City Council of the City of Farmington Hills met in Regular Session at City Hall on January 22, 1979. Mayor Oppert-Hauser convened the meeting at 7:30 P.M. Council Members present were: Alkatreh, Dolan, Jones, Smith, and Soronen. Mr. Deacon was absent due to vacation. Others present were: Acting City Manager Cairns, Deputy City Clerk Thomas, and City Attorney Bibeau.

After Cost Hearing regarding Linden Street sanitary sewer improvements in the amount of \$61,800 the roll was unanimously confirmed.

After Public Hearing for necessity, Special Assessment District for sidewalk installation along the south side of 13 Mile Road from Orchard Lake Road was unanimously established.

Amendatory Ordinance No. C-19-78 to the City Code regarding the 13 Mile Road Sanitary Arm and the Northwest Water Pressure District was unanimously enacted.

Amendatory Ordinance No. C-82-175 rezoning property on the north side of Northwestern Highway, east of Middlebelt Road from Single Family Residential (RA-1) use to Office Service District (OS-1) use was unanimously approved.

Resolution to petition the Michigan State Department of Highways and Transportation to place identification signs for the City along State and Interstate Highways surrounding and through the City of Farmington Hills was unanimously approved.

Resolution to appropriate \$4,000 as Cash Match for federal funds for the Police Department Special Patrol Operational Team was unanimously approved.

General Fund 1978-79 Budget transfer of C.E.T.A. Community Service Officer position to Police Officer C.E.T.A. position to be budgeted as of September, 1979 was unanimously approved.

Consent Judgement settlement regarding multiple family development at the southwest corner of 11 Mile and Middlebelt Roads was accepted by a vote of 5-0-1. Mr. Alkatreh abstained.

Preliminary Plat (30 lots) for Acorn Valley Subdivision including escrow deposit of \$6,500 was unanimously approved.

Resolution to permit Clarencville School to levy taxes during City Tax Collection period was unanimously approved.

Traffic Control Order No. 1.C.26.28 establishing eastbound and westbound Lamar Street yield signs at Springbrook was unanimously approved.

Traffic Control Order No. 1.C.26.27 establishing eastbound and westbound Fink Street yield signs at Springbrook was unanimously approved.

Resolution authorizing City employee participation in the International City Management Association deferred compensation program-Retirement Corporation (ICMA-RC) was unanimously approved.

Cost Hearing date set for February 19, 1979 regarding sanitary sewer improvement along Sans Souci Street.

Public Hearing date set for February 19, 1979 regarding the vacation of Colfax Street from Halsted Road approximately 1.871 ft. east.

Preliminary Plat for Phase One of Country Ridge Subdivision (102 lots) was unanimously approved.

Resolution appointing Michigan National Bank as paying agent for the following Bond issues was unanimously approved:

\$115,000 Kendallwood Road Improvement
\$18,000 Edgemoor Sewer Improvement
\$285,000 Pleasant Valley Sewer Improvement

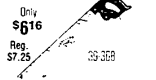
