Government trial balloons falling flat

Press releases by government officials, trial balloons to see how the public reacts, seem to have been of escalating. A few weeks ago they said they wanted to register 18-year-olds in case we might need to know how many are available for defense needs.

I reacted negatively because the Bureau of the Census should know within a fraction of a percent accuracy how many people there are. We have already paid for that information. Births and deaths are registered, so if all they really want is statistics they can get them with less expense than the complex nationwide registration process.

Then releases suggested redefining patriotism by including females and planning for social service as well as military service. My mind went back to

all sorts of theorizing after World War II.

EMOTIONAL OPINIONS among veterans in 1946 often distorted memory. We were saying the young should experience the discipline and authority which seemed to have straightened out our lives. Somehow we forgot that 12 years of public school had provided those experiences with limited success.

I also remember pain and bullies and braggers in uniform taunted civilians because they didn't fit the system. "Unfit" became a commonly used word to destroy a sense of self-worth in people who had to live with a disability or limitation.

Social service in the style of the Peace Corps seems a way to broaden patriotism to make room for everyone. But I am haunted by the threat of los-

ing unusual people so crucial to society. Most artists develop skill early in life and even a few short years away from it destroys precious talent. We also need creativity from many who are non-conformists of one sort or another.

THEN PRESS releases moved another notch to speak of a standby system so we can mobilize a fighting force in a short time. Fury mounts as we feel we have been led along a path we didn't expect. It probably was clear between the lines all the time. But one wonders if the military is really finding the volunteer system a failure or if it is only failing to lock everybody into tracks set by authoritarians.

During the past presidential campaign the slogans about having a government as good as our people perplexed me. We elected the man with

those slogans and it is time to ask ourselves that we think he meant. We are compassionate people needing systems which treat young adults who seem "different" with compassion. We cannot allow a system which makes it publicly obvious that certain people are labelled unfit. That is, we cannot do this if the system is as good as our people.

LOVE OF PEACE is part of our patriotism. Our young people should develop useful skills while contributing to peace. Some need discipline in a military service opportunity. Some need to cross lines in America and between nations in people-to-people cultural interchanges. Some need to be helpful by sharing skills with less advantaged people. In keeping with the best in us, our systems should be peace-making and not merely peace-keeping.

Professor speaks for ecumenical day

Dr. Michael Novak professor and writer, will be the guest speaker at the fourth annual Jewish-Catholic Day on Thursday, March 8, at Madonna College in Livonia.

Sponsored by the League of Catholic Women of Detroit and the League of Jewish Women of Detroit, the event will feature a "petite luncheon" at noon followed by an address by the noted columnist, philosopher, theologian and educator.

Auxiliary Bishop John Mesch of the Catholic Archdiocese of Detroit will deliver the invocation; Rabbi Ephry Specter of Adat Shalom Synagogue in Farmington will offer the benediction. The Mercierites, the 19-member cho-

ral group from Our Lady of Mercy High School in Farmington, will perform during luncheon. Milton Jaffe of the Jewish Federation will introduce the guest speaker.

Dr. Novak, who speaks of the importance of the human spirit and the family in man's relation to government and in man's relation to the world, will discuss "The Family - Out of Favor?"

The current adjunct professor at the American Enterprise Institute in Washington, he formerly taught at Harvard, Stanford, Old Westbury and Syracuse universities and served as associate director for humanities at the Rockefeller Foundation.

He is the author of 10 philosophical

works and two novels, and serves as an associate editor and contributor to several religious and secular journals.

Dr. Novak has worked as a journalist and teacher in Mexico and Italy, and has covered political campaigns as well as human interest concerns across the country.

His column appears locally in the Detroit News.

The purpose of Jewish-Catholic Day, according to League of Catholic Women president Marilyn Landay, is "to foster camaraderie among Jewish and Catholic women involved in community service, and to present a good program of interest to both groups."

Homosexuality, healing viewed in workshops

The Center for Pastoral Studies at Orchard Lake is holding two workshops, "The Homosexual Catholic - Is She Really 'Gay'?" on Saturday, March 3, and "Healing Ministry," on Wednesday, March 7. Both run from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and cost \$10.

The first workshop will include an examination of historical and contemporary trends regarding ministry to the homosexual.

It will be conducted by the Rev. Anthony Kosnik, academic dean and professor moral theology at St. Cyril and Methodius Seminary. A noted writer and lecturer, he is co-author of "Human Sexuality: New Directions in American Thought," a study commissioned by the Catholic Theological Society of America.

The "Healing Ministry" workshop will be conducted by Dr. Carl Middleton, director of ministerial healing at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital and Visiting
