Spring program offers variety

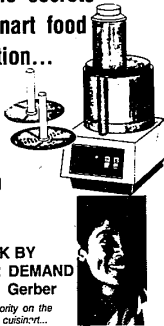

It's a time of change and renewal and to help you find something new to delve into, the Farmington Community Library will be offering several programs and services this month.  
Adventure Gaming will be the subject of a program sponsored by the Young Adult Department at 7 p.m. March 6. Conducted at the Farmington Hills Library, the program will feature speakers Tim Pilson of Joe's Hobby Center in Farmington and Duke Seifried from Heritage Models who will explain and demonstrate different types of adventure gaming, including fantasy gaming and the painting of miniatures.  
Books to be discussed in March by our adult book discussion group include Mark Twain's "A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court" on March 8 and "The Child Buyer" by John Hersey on March 22. Both discussions begin at 10 a.m. in the Farmington branch library. Come for one, come for both. Everyone is welcome.  
At 7 p.m. March 22, our final Using the Library seminar will be offered at the Farmington Hills library. The session will give a brief orientation to library services and materials.

At the Farmington Hills branch, pre-schoolers and kindergartners are invited to join us at 2 p.m., March 5 when we have several feline films to enjoy. On March 15 at 10:30 a.m. we'll have a mini-music jam session. Children are asked to bring a simple percussion instrument from home for this program.  
Programs for elementary school children will be featured on Saturdays at both libraries. The Farmington Hills branch will offer foreign folktales in film in honor of the International Year of the Child on March 10 and a Sherlock Holmes Festival featuring the "Silver Blaze" and "Sherlock Holmes Meets Mr. Magoo" March 24.

THESE PROGRAMS, which are designed for older children only begin at 2 p.m. The Farmington branch will offer a similar program of folklore films at 2 p.m. March 17.
