Two long-time members of the Metro Bowling Club, All Star League and one of the best bowlers the game has had during the past 50 years will be inducted into the Detroit Bowling Hall of Fame when the doors to the Shrine open at 10:00 p.m. May 15.

The trio to be honored include John Ruggerio, captain of the Shrine team for 12 years, Edna (Dillon) (Kilinski), one of the first women ever to bowl a perfect game, and Norm White, former program director at Station WJLB and an official of the Old Timers Association for several decades.

The choices were made by the Hall of Fame Commission and the induction ceremonies will follow the pattern set several years with dinner on Sunday evening May 12, which this year happens to be Mother's Day.

ANITA CANTALINE and her Jac-Bo team bettered its league mark for the season last Wednesday night when they girls rolled a 2577 series in the Ladies Major League at Crown Lanes.

The series round included a 1110 game which is a new high for the season and 14 pins better than the mark it set several months ago.

Ruthy Hatfield set the pace for the team when she rolled a 285 in a 610 series.

THINGS RETURNED to normal in the Woodland Lanes Classic when the shotpotters posted a pair of 700 series and another of the group posted a 280.

Ken Brown shared the way in the high scoring night when he put together games of 247, 247 and 222 for a 716.

A few lanes away, Dave Kaleszewski closed with a 267 for a 702. Meanwhile, Gordie Cantwell put together a string of 11 strikes and was headed for a perfect game until the final ball. Here the pressure got him. He left up the No. 2 pin and had to settle for a 299.

THERE SEEMS to be no way to stop John Hurley from setting one of the greatest records of all time.

Taking his regular turn in the Monday morning doubles league at Woodland Lane, he opened with a 241, followed with 248 and closed with 260 for 739. It was the 17th 700 series he has bowled in the league this season. This week he added a 583 finishing game to the four game series for a 3000.

THE LADIES did well, too, in the Woodland Classic. Mary Foster showed the way with games of 214 and 225 for a 611. Betty New was right behind with 605. High single honore went to Mary Novak who posted a 257 in the Cherry Hill Teachers league.

GEORGE VIKONSKY used a 257 game to roll a 626 and earn the

percentage title in the Viper League at Garden Lane. He needed the big points because Len Bond was only 10 pins back with a 621. He did it by yielding to these two and batted third with 595.

IN THE SLOW POKER league at Plaza Lanes, Joe Rodighiero, a 140 average bowler, put on quite a show when she linked games of 235, 180 and 183 for a 598.

GENE KITCH and Joe Gumbis put on quite a show in the Ford League at Woodland Lanes before Joe clinched top honors with 634. He had a 236 in 634 while Kitch had a 236 in 618.

Lathrup swimmers drop finale, 92-72

Southfield-Lathrup ended its dual-meet swimming season with a 92-72 loss to Bloomfield Hills Andover last Wednesday at home. Lathrup finished with a 6-7 overall record.

Lathrup's Roberts brothers, Chuck and John, each won two individual events. Chuck, a senior, won the 200-yard individual medley (2:13.4) and the 100-yard butterfly (1:01.2). John, a junior, took the 50 freestyle (23.0) and the 100 freestyle (51.0).

Lathrup took two other firsts: Todd Winston compiled 237.60 to win the diving event, and Dave Bowser was clocked in 1:54.0 to win the 200 freestyle.

Lathrup will compete in the Metro Suburban Association conference meet

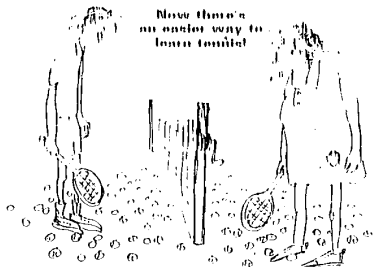
next Tuesday and Wednesday (March 6-7) at Birmingham Groves.

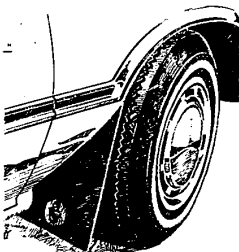

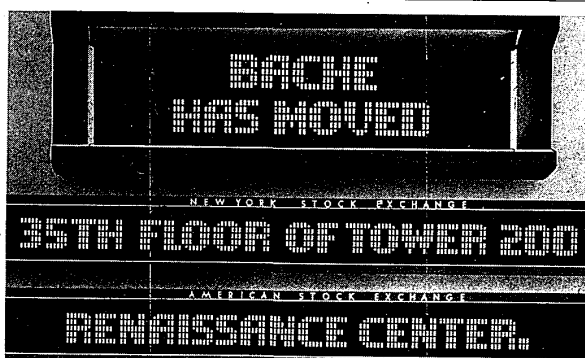
