

Tie one on for spring

For individual, variation and versatile dressing, there is an endless variety of scarf tricks that add the perfect finishing touch, whether it be wrapped around the head, neck, chest, waist or hips.

Echo scarfs make news this spring and summer with bodywrapping ideas for head to toe, and with new looks that work as well on city streets as sandy beaches.

Look to the cottons as the natural accessory for belting, braiding and bandaging. The Echo collection includes the classic wovens, window pane voiles

and gauzy textured sheers, all in a range of squares and oblongs.

The large pareos and rectangles are perfect for making wrap skirts. The variety in oblongs makes it a snap to wrap up the waist or bandeau the top.

Bold stripes, dots, stenciled florals and tropicals are among the prints, each coming in a wide palette of colors.

Novelty newcomers shine in silver and gold lurex, mufflers in raw silk, bias and bow ties and terry cloth, available in this area at Bettinas, 16300 North Park Drive, Southfield.

Sizes in all fabrics range from the smallest 18-inch handkerchief square to the oversized pareo, and then on to the longest and widest oversized wrap.



The bias ties provide easy versatility. Here a bold spring stripe is bowed at the back of the neck and the ends are left free flowing. Echo's collection includes long 8-by-51 and shorter 6-by-44 inch bias ties that make neat bows and single waist wraps.



For a terrific beach look, tie a 36-inch cotton square into an oblong, twist the middle of the scarf once, place it over the chest and knot the ends in back.



Scarfs — both oblong and square — are the perfect accessory to be tied either wide or thin at the waist. Here a silk and rayon, shimmering with silver threads is tied and bowed at the side. The same scarf does double duty as a smashing evening bandeau.

For all kinds of sports a brightly colored terry cloth oblong is a natural. Perfect for warm up, yet some scarfs double as a sweatband during the event.

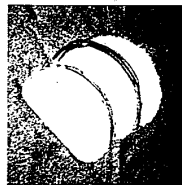

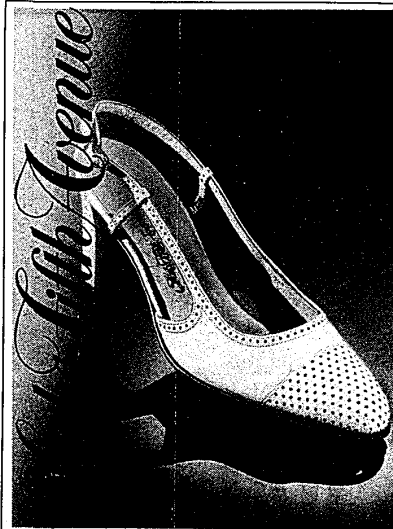
