## CONTINUING SHOWS

**Gallerly 22** — Paintings and drawings, "Personal Interpretations" by Bertie Cohen of Bloomfield Hills, will run through March 17. Gallery hours are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, 10 a.m. to 9 p.m. Thursday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, 22 E. Long Lake, Bloomfield Hills.

**W. F. Mullaly Galleries** — Paintings and graphics by Donald Sutphin will be exhibited through March 31. The artist attended Boston School of Fine Arts and the Art Students League of New York where he studied under George Grosz. He lives in Florence, Italy, where he teaches woodcut and etching. **Pontiac Art Center** — "Air Earth Water," an exhibit of three Michigan artists, will be on display at the center through March 11. The artists are Loraine Chambers McCarty, Phyllis J. Reynolds and Winifred Wright Edwards. Ms. McCarty, represented in private and museum collections here and abroad, affirms the open sky and man's desire to fly. Water is one of Ms. Reynolds's favorite subjects. Her free-flowing, yet controlled style with Ori-
