'Worse Threat Than Inflation'

 A recession with sizable unemployment is a greater threat at present than inflation, says University of Michigan economist George Katona, who calls for a reversal of the government's tight-money policy.
 Addressing the 17th annual Conference on the Economic Outlook Friday at the university, Prof. Katona also predicted that a recent decline in consumer sentiment, revealed in his Survey Research Center studies, probably would contribute to a drop of 5 to 10 per cent in 1970 new car sales.
 Good news - particularly in the areas of Vietnam peace, a slowdown in price increases, and loosening of tight-money policies - is needed to reverse current consumer pessimism, he suggested.

"TODAY WHEN the urban crisis and race problems are viewed by many as the greatest problems facing us, the government's economic policy threatens to increase unemployment, especially among the blacks and among city people," Katona said.
 "On the other hand, government policy impedes the most powerful weapons against inflation, namely increase in production and in productivity."
 "I believe the time has come for a reversal of the government's tight-money policy - first of all because it is doubtful whether tight money helps greatly against inflation."
 The U-M economist agreed that federal fiscal policy may help to control inflation, but said that high interest rates appear to have a twofold effect:
 "They not only reduce demand, but also make for some advance borrowing and spending on the part of business in anticipation of a crunch and represent rising costs that push prices up."

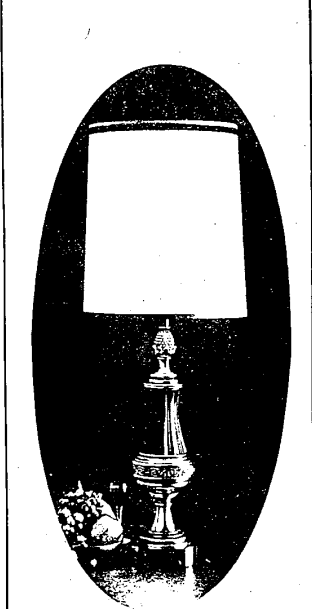
SKI TIPS

Safety Code Tightened By Red Cross

All water safety instructors, currently authorized by the American Red Cross, are required to complete a mandatory retraining course before the end of the year.
 After December, those instructors who do not meet the new requirements, will no longer be eligible to teach Red Cross certified swimming and lifesaving courses.
 For the convenience of interested persons, the 8-hour training course will be taught at Stevenson High School, 33500 Six Mile, Livonia. Classes will be held three consecutive Wednesdays, Dec. 3, 10 and 17 from 7 to 10 p.m.
 Students must bring bathing suits. There will be pool activity in all three sessions.
 The course is open to all water safety instructors who hold a current authorization. It is not an instructor refresher or review course.

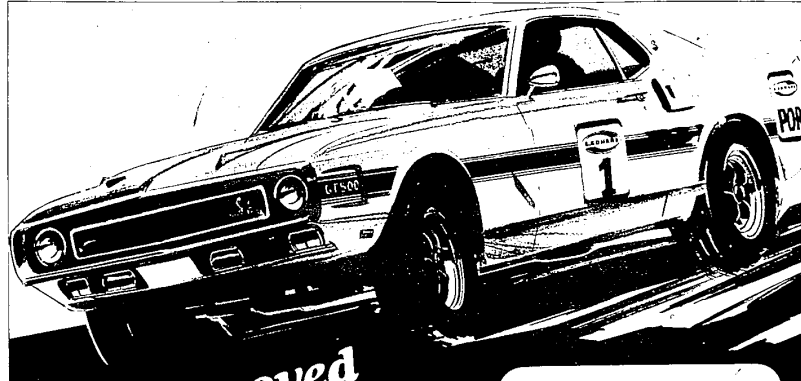
