## Oakland ADC Mothers To Get \$30 Per Child

The Oakland County Board of Supervisors at its meeting of Nov. 20, passed a resolution appropriating \$25,000 for an additional supplemental clothing allowance for A.D.C. recipients, to provide for the remainder of the year of 1969. The money is to be distributed on a "needs basis" at the rate of up to \$30 per child.

The board had previously appropriated \$90,000 in Sept. 1969 in lieu of issuing clothing from the county clothing store. As of Oct. 23, the Department of Social Services reported a balance of \$45,20, after having provided cash allotments for 3,039 children. There are estimated to be 100 children remaining to be clothed.

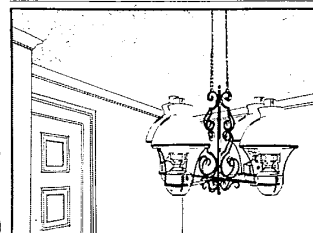

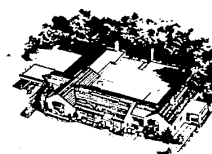

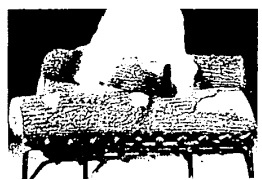
