Governor recommends arts budget increase

The governor's budget calls for a record allocation of \$7.2 million for support of the arts in Michigan. It is anticipated that this figure will be suppenented with federal funds amounting to some \$700,000. Comparable figures for the current fiscal year are \$5 million in state funds and \$500,000 in federal support.

The proposed MCA budget must be reviewed and voted on by appropriation committees in the House and Senate prior to final action by both houses of the legislature.

Significant changes in the budget in-clude increases of 56 percent for com-munity arts councils, 48 percent for op-erational support of more than 60 statewide artsorganizations of all disci-plines, and 33 percent for locally initi-ated "grass roots" arts projects.

This year, for the first time, the council has proposed a grants program which will provide direct assistance to individual artists. The governor's budget also recognizes the council's need for additional field and administrative personnel by recommending an increase of 14 staff members.

Gov. William Milliken's budget recommendation for 1979-80 includes a significant increase in state funding for the Michigan Council for the Arts tions process.

Agenda items include informatin on the MCA's budget for fiscal year 1980, legislative contacts and discussion of the appropriations process.

Walter R. Boris, chairman of the council said, "In recent years these public meetings have been effective in drawing together artists, arts managers and arts advocates who favor increased appropriation of state dollars for support of Michigan arts and artists. Due to the involvement of these individuals the council has received significant budget increases during the past four years. We strongly encourage Michigan arts supporters to join in this event."

Also featured will be an address by Rep. Ray Kehres on "Legislative Appropriations Process." Jack Feeheley, of the government relations department of Michigan Consolidated Gas will discuss "Effective Legislative Contacts."




