Well, North came as close as possible, scoring 97:90 total points to tie the outstate gymnastics power in the state meet. And, as far as coach Mary Johnessee is concerned, North's goal has been reached.
"Ludington's been the state champion for the past four years, and my girls were determined to take it away from them," she said. A senior who hopes to participate in gymnastics at the University of Michigan next season, McLean tied for sixth place on the beam (17.28), and finished in a three-way tie for sixth in floor exercise (17.0).


