give kids safety tips

The Easter Seal Society of Oakland County offers the following 10 tips as ways parents can make home play yard equipment safer. • Check to make sure nuts, bolts and clamps are properly tightened. • Replace rusted parts. Sand metal tubing that is rusted and repaint with unleaded paint.

Oil all metal parts regularly throughout the season.
Check rope swings for wear and stress. Replace ropes that might break in mid-swing.

areas. heplace ropes that might break in mid-swing. Inspect equipment for sharp edges, exposed screws and bolks, and open-ended S hooks. Place tape over sharp edges and exposed screws and bolts, close S hooks by pinching with pliers. Sharp edges and hooks can tear clothes and skin.

Check exercise rings. These should be at least 10 inches in diameter. Smaller exercise rings can trap a child's head and these should be dis-carded where children will not find and play with them.
